RE: Administrative: HAVA Section 261 Polling Place and Website
 Accessibility Training

The current HAVA Section 261 accessibility grant awarded to counties by the Secretary of State allows for reimbursement of expenses related to staff attending polling place and website accessibility training. This memorandum contains information about both polling place surveyor training and web accessibility training.

Polling Place Accessibility Surveyor Training

For polling place accessibility surveyor training, the Secretary of State is once again contracting with the Department of Rehabilitation to offer several sessions in April of this year. Similar to those offered in 2013, the Department of Rehabilitation will offer both basic and intermediate level training sessions.
