- RE: VoteCal: System of Record

As a result of your help and dedication over these many years, the Secretary of State (SOS) is pleased to declare VoteCal the system of record for voter registration in California. The project could not have been successful without each and every county's participation in the activities from mock election, testing, verifying functionality, and analyzing and monitoring the data in VoteCal.

The SOS will now be implementing functionality in VoteCal that was dependent on VoteCal being declared the system of record. The table below lists and describes the new activities that will be performed with VoteCal.
