





CIRCULATING AND FILING SCHEDULE

(If the Proponent files the petition with the county on a date prior to
07/13/07, the county has eight working days from the filing of the petition
to determine the total number of signatures affixed to the petition and to
transmit the total to the Secretary of State) (EC §9030(b)).
 - d. Secretary of State determines whether the total number
of signatures filed with all county clerks/registrars of
voters meets the minimum number of required signatures
and notifies the counties Friday, 08/03/07*
 - e. Last day for county to determine total number of qualified
voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate
with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State
(EC §9030(d)(e)) Monday, 09/17/07

Circulating and Filing Schedule continued:

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who signed the petition on a date other than 08/03/07, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification). (EC §9030(d)(e)).

- f. If the signature count is more than 477,369 or less than 412,273 then the Secretary of State certifies the petition as qualified or failed, and notifies the counties. If the signature count is between 412,273 and 477,369 inclusive, then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of all signatures (EC §9030(f)(g); 9031(a))..... Thursday, 09/27/07*
- g. Last day for county to determine actual number of all qualified voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State. (EC §9031(b)(c)).....Friday, 11/09/07

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who have signed the petition on a date other than 09/27/07, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification)
(EC §9031(b)(c)).

- h. Secretary of State certifies whether the petition has been signed by the number of qualified voters required to declare the petition sufficient (EC §9031(d); 9033).....Tuesday, 11/13/07*

*Date varies based on the date of county receipt.

IMPORTANT POINTS

- California law prohibits the use of signatures, names and addresses gathered on initiative petitions for any purpose other than to qualify the initiative measure for the ballot. This means that the petitions cannot be used to create or add to mailing lists or similar lists for any purpose, including fundraising or requests for support. Any such misuses constitutes a crime under California law. Elections Code section 18650; *Bilofsky v. Deukmejian* (1981) 124 Cal. App. 3d 825, 177 Cal. Rptr. 621; 63 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 37 (1980).
- Please refer to Elections Code sections 100, 101, 104, 9001, 9008, 9009, 9021, and 9022 for appropriate format and type consideration in printing, typing and otherwise preparing your initiative petition for circulation and signatures. Please send a copy of the petition after you have it printed. This copy is not for our review or approval, but to supplement our file.
- Your attention is directed to the campaign disclosure requirements of the **Political Reform Act of 1974**, Government Code section 81000 et seq.
- When writing or calling state or county elections officials, provide the official title of the initiative which was prepared by the Attorney General. Use of this title will assist elections officials in referencing the proper file.
- When a petition is presented to the county elections official for filing by someone other than the proponent, the required authorization shall include the name or names of the persons filing the petition.
- When filing the petition with the county elections official, please provide a blank petition for elections official use.



The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

RECORDING OF CONTACTS WITH PEACE OFFICERS. INITIATIVE STATUTE. Requires peace officers to create an audio-visual recording of all contacts with or searches of citizens.

Requires that a copy of the recording be provided to affected citizens who are arrested and charged with a crime. Mandates dismissal of pending criminal charges for arrests after

January 1, 1996, if the individual charged did not receive a copy of an audio-visual recording of the related contact or search. Requires two-thirds vote of Legislature to amend provisions.

Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: Unknown net costs to state and local governments, but potentially in the hundreds of millions of dollars on a one-time basis, with ongoing costs in the tens of millions of dollars. 

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CALIFORNIA

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of _____ County (or City and County), hereby propose amendments to the Penal Code, relating to law enforcement, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to that general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed statute (full title and text of measure) reads as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1054.11 is added to the Penal Code, to read:

1054.11. (a) Anytime any peace officer makes contact with or searches any person within the State of California, the peace officer shall record the contact or search with an electronic recording device capable of providing an audio and visual reproduction of the contact or search.

(b) If the person contacted or searched is subsequently arrested and related criminal charges are filed, a copy of the audio and visual reproduction of the electronically recorded contact or search shall be provided to the defendant.

(c) If any person is hereafter or has been, since January 1, 1996, contacted or searched by a peace officer and related criminal charges are or were subsequently filed, and the case is pending trial as of the effective date of this section, all charges shall be dismissed if an audio and visual reproduction of the contact or search is not provided to the defendant.

SEC. 2. The provisions of this act shall not be amended by the Legislature except by a statute passed in each house, by roll call vote, entered in the journal, two-thirds of the membership of each house concurring, and that is consistent with, and furthers the purpose of the act.
