

Circulating and Filing Schedule continued:

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who signed the petition on a date other than 07/03/10, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification). (Elec. Code § 9030(d)(e)).

- f. If the signature count is more than 477,369 or less than 412,273 then the Secretary of State certifies the petition as qualified or failed, and notifies the counties. If the signature count is between 412,273 and 477,369 inclusive, then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of all signatures (EC §9030(f)(g); 9031(a)).....Monday, 08/23/10*
- g. Last day for county to determine actual number of all qualified voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State. (Elec. Code § 9031(b)(c)). Wednesday, 10/06/10

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who have signed the petition on a date other than 08/23/10, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification.) (Elec. Code § 9031(b)(c).)

- h. Secretary of State certifies whether the petition has been signed by the number of qualified voters required to declare the petition sufficient (Elec. Code §§ 9031(d), 9033)..... Sunday, 10/10/10*

IMPORTANT POINTS

- California law prohibits the use of signatures, names and addresses gathered on initiative petitions for any purpose other than to qualify the initiative measure for the ballot. This means that the petitions cannot be used to create or add to mailing lists or similar lists for any purpose, including fundraising or requests for support. Any such misuses constitutes a crime under California law. Elections Code section 18650; *Bilofsky v. Deukmejian* (1981) 124 Cal.App.3d 825, 177 Cal.Rptr. 621; 63 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 37 (1980).
- Please refer to Elections Code sections 100, 101, 104, 9001, 9008, 9009, 9021, and 9022 for appropriate format and type consideration in printing, typing and otherwise preparing your initiative petition for circulation and signatures. Please send a copy of the petition after you have it printed. This copy is not for our review or approval, but to supplement our file.
- Your attention is directed to the campaign disclosure requirements of the **Political Reform Act of 1974**, Government Code section 81000 et seq.
- When writing or calling state or county elections officials, provide the official title of the initiative which was prepared by the Attorney General. Use of this title will assist elections officials in referencing the proper file.
- When a petition is presented to the county elections official for filing by someone other than the proponent, the required authorization shall include the name or names of the persons filing the petition.
- When filing the petition with the county elections official, please provide a blank petition for elections official use.





The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

LIMITS PENSION PAYMENTS THAT NEW PUBLIC EMPLOYEES MAY RECEIVE

UPON RETIREMENT. INITIATIVE STATUTE. Limits the amount of pension payments that any new state or local public employee may receive upon retirement to \$100,000 per year.

Allows annual cost-of-living increases in proportion to the California Consumer Price Index, so long as total annual pension payments do not exceed \$162,500. Prohibits the Legislature from adjusting these limits unless three-quarters of both houses approve. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government:

Minor reductions in annual public sector pension costs in the short run. Major reductions in annual public sector pension and retiree health payments several decades from now.

Possible increases in other public employee compensation costs, depending on future decisions made by governmental entities and voters. (09-0080.)

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of County (or City and County), hereby propose to add the following provision to the Government Code of California, relating to public employee pensions, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to that general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed statutory addition (full title and text of measure) reads as follows:

PUBLIC EMPLOYEE PENSION LIMITATION LAW

SECTION 1. Section 7500.5 is added to the Government Code, to read:

7500.5. (a) This section shall apply to any state or local public employee first hired on and after the effective date of its provisions. The limitations in this section do not apply to any other benefit that is not a retirement allowance.

(b) The pension of any public employee to whom this section applies, which is paid by a state or local public retirement system, shall not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) per year at the time when the employee first begins to receive payment. The limit on the amount of a pension paid annually to an individual public employee retiree may subsequently be adjusted only pursuant to the process described in subdivision (c).

(c) The retirement board that administers the payment of a pension to a public employee retiree subject to this section may annually increase the amount of the pension paid to an individual retiree to reflect the proportional increase in the Consumer Price Index for California, as determined by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the previous year and the resulting amount may exceed the limit described in subdivision (b) for that retiree. These increases may be compounded, but no pension of a public employee retiree subject to this section, regardless of its initial amount, shall exceed, in any instance, one hundred sixty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$162,500) per year.

(d) This section shall not be amended by the Legislature except by statute passed in each house by rollcall vote entered in the journal, at least three-quarters of the membership concurring, or by a statute that becomes effective only when approved by the electors.
