

(If the Proponent files the petition with the county on a date prior to
07/16/12, the county has eight working days from the filing of the petition
to determine the total number of signatures affixed to the petition and to
transmit the total to the Secretary of State) (Elections Code § 9030(b).)

 - d. Secretary of State determines whether the total number
of signatures filed with all county clerks/registrars of
voters meets the minimum number of required signatures
and notifies the counties.....Saturday, 08/04/12*

 - e. Last day for county to determine total number of qualified
voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate
with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State
(Elections Code § 9030(d) & (e)).....Tuesday, 09/18/12

Circulating and Filing Schedule continued

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who signed the petition on a date other than 08/04/12, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification). (Elections Code § 9030(d) & (e).)

- f. If the signature count is more than 555,236 or less than 479,522 then the Secretary of State certifies the petition as qualified or failed, and notifies the counties. If the signature count is between 479,522 and 555,236 inclusive, then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of **all** signatures (Elections Code §§ 9030(f) & (g); 9031(a)).....Friday, 09/28/12*

- g. Last day for county to determine actual number of all qualified voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State. (Elections Code § 9031(b) & (c)).....Tuesday, 11/13/12

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who have signed the petition on a date other than 09/28/12, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after the county's receipt of notification.) (Elections Code § 9031(b) & (c).)

- h. Secretary of State certifies whether the petition has been signed by the number of qualified voters required to declare the petition sufficient (Elections Code §§ 9031(d), 9033)...Saturday, 11/17/12*

*Date varies based on the date of county receipt.

IMPORTANT POINTS

- California law prohibits the use of signatures, names and addresses gathered on initiative petitions for any purpose other than to qualify the initiative measure for the ballot. This means that the petitions cannot be used to create or add to mailing lists or similar lists for any purpose, including fundraising or requests for support. Any such misuses constitutes a crime under California law. Elections Code § 18650; *Bilofsky v. Deukmejian* (1981) 124 Cal.App.3d 825, 177 Cal.Rptr. 621; 63 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 37 (1980).
- Please refer to Elections Code §§ 100, 101, 104, 9008, 9009, 9013, 9021, and 9022 for appropriate format and type consideration in printing, typing and otherwise preparing your initiative petition for circulation and signatures. Please send a copy of the petition after you have it printed. This copy is not for our review or approval, but to supplement our file.
- Your attention is directed to the campaign disclosure requirements of the **Political Reform Act of 1974**, Government Code section 81000 et seq.
- When writing or calling state or county elections officials, provide the official title of the initiative which was prepared by the Attorney General. Use of this title will assist elections officials in referencing the proper file.
- When a petition is presented to the county elections official for filing by someone other than the proponent, the required authorization shall include the name or names of the persons filing the petition.
- When filing the petition with the county elections official, please provide a blank petition for elections official use.

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

EDUCATION. REPEALS NON-DISCRIMINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL INSTRUCTION. NARROWS REQUIREMENT THAT STUDENTS STUDY ROLE AND CONTRIBUTIONS OF VARIOUS GROUPS. INITIATIVE STATUTE. Repeals

requirement that schools prohibit instructional materials that discriminate against persons based on their gender, religion, sexual orientation, disabilities, or other characteristics. Repeals requirements that school instructional materials recognize societal contributions of various groups to the economic, political, and social development of California and the United States.

Prohibits exclusion of a historical figure from instructional materials solely on the basis that the historical figure is a member in, or possesses a characteristic associated with, a specified protected group. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government: **This measure would not impose additional costs on school districts.** (11-0093)



AMENDED TEXT OF INITIATIVE

Section 1. Title: This measure shall amend the Education Code and shall be known and may be cited as the Children Learning Accurate Social Science Act.

Section 2. Instruction in social sciences shall include the early history of California, the United States of America, and world history. Study shall include relevant and accurate historical portrayals of the role and contributions of racial and ethnic groups. Further, no historical figure shall be excluded from inclusion in social science instruction, instructional materials, or textbooks merely because of membership in, or possessing a characteristic associated with, a protected class as defined in section 220 of the Education Code. Inclusion of the study of a person in social science instruction shall be accurate and based solely upon historical significance rather than membership in a protected class.

Section 3. In kindergarten through grade 12, a teacher shall not give instruction, and no textbook or instructional material shall be adopted, calculated to promote acts of discrimination against racial and ethnic groups.

Section 4. Nothing in this Act shall require the expenditure of additional tax dollars for textbooks or instructional materials. This Act supersedes all other statutory provisions relating to this subject, including but not limited to, sections 51204.5, 51500, 51501, 60040 and 60044 of the Education Code.

Section 5. If any provision of this Act is for any reason found unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining provisions shall not be affected, but shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Act are severable.
