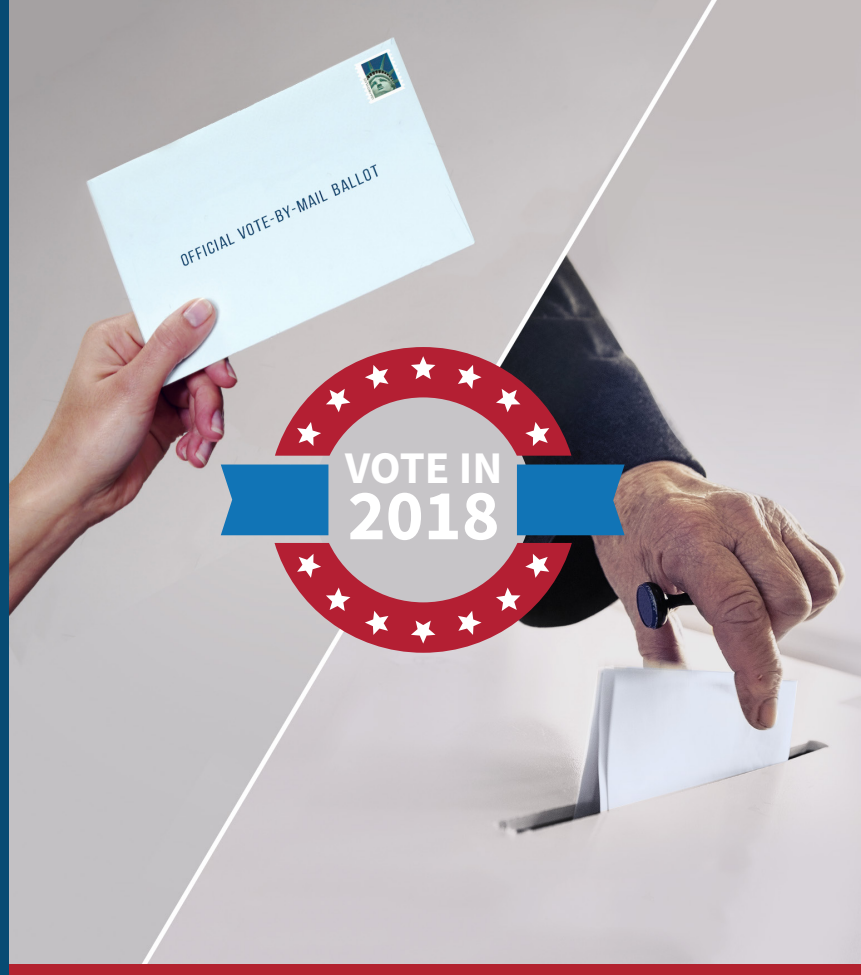

## Register to Vote

To register to vote in California, you must be:

**A U.S. citizen and a resident of California;**

**18 years old or older on Election Day;**

**Not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony; and**

**Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court.**

You can apply online at [www.RegisterToVote.ca.gov](http://www.RegisterToVote.ca.gov) or find an application at post offices, libraries and some government offices. In most cases you must register at least 15 days before Election Day to be eligible to vote in that election.

If you missed the registration deadline, you can conditionally register to vote and vote. Contact your county elections official for more information. You must re-register to vote if you move, or change your name or political party preference.

## Pre-Register

To pre-register to vote in California, you must:

- Be 16 or 17 years old, and
- Meet all of the other eligibility requirements to vote.

You will automatically be registered to vote on your 18th birthday.

## Vote by Mail

Any registered voter can vote by mail in California. Fill out the vote-by-mail ballot application in your Voter Information Guide, find one at [www.sos.ca.gov](http://www.sos.ca.gov), or contact your county elections office. Your completed application must arrive at your county elections office at least seven days before Election Day.

To ensure your voted ballot is delivered by the deadline, your voted ballot must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by your county elections office no later than three days after Election Day.

All registered voters in Madera, Napa, Nevada, Sacramento, and San Mateo counties will receive a mailed ballot 28 days before an election. Voters in these five counties can now decide if they would like to cast their ballot at any Vote Center in their county up to 10 days before Election Day, through the mail, or at a secure ballot drop-off box location. ## Provisional Voting

Even if your name is not on the voter list at the polling place, you have the right to vote with a provisional ballot in the county where you are registered to vote. Your provisional ballot will be counted only after the elections official has confirmed you are a registered voter and you did not already vote in that election. The poll worker can give you information about how to check if your provisional ballot was counted and, if it was not counted, the reason why. ## Ballot Information

Registered voters receive the Secretary of State's Official Voter Information Guide in the mail a few weeks before Election Day. County elections offices mail a county voter information guide to voters. These nonpartisan guides include information about ballot measures, candidates, voting rights, and more.

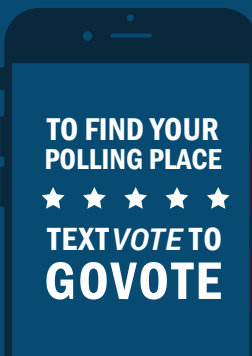
