

**TRENDS**

Since the last 60-Day Report of Registration for a primary in a presidential election year (April 6, 2012):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 17,037,414 to 17,268,833.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote decreased from 71.9% to 70.1%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 21.3% to 23.9%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party decreased from 77.9% to 75.6%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.5% to 43.7%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 30.3% to 27.5%.
