

³The presidential and statewide direct primaries were split in 2008. The presidential primary election was held in February, and the statewide direct primary election was held in June; therefore, by law, two 154-day reports were published.

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TRENDS

Since the last 154-Day Report of Registration in a presidential election year (January 5, 2016):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 17,259,413 to 18,084,999.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 70.2% to 72.9%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference decreased from 24% to 23.3%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party increased from 75.2% to 76.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.1% to 45.1%
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 27.6% to 27.1%.
