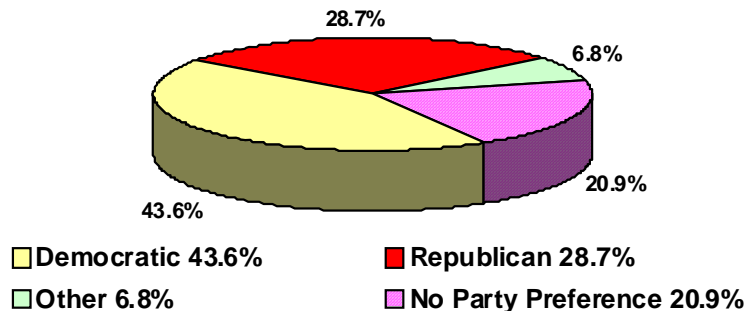

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TRENDS

Since the last 154-day Report of Registration for a Statewide Direct Primary in a gubernatorial election year (January 5, 2010):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 16,909,574 to 17,660,257.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 72.6% to 73.4%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 20.2% to 20.9%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party decreased from 79.1% to 76.7%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party decreased from 44.6% to 43.6%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 30.8% to 28.7%.
