

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TRENDS

Since the last 60-day Report of Registration for a Statewide Direct Primary in a gubernatorial election year (April 7, 2006):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 15,570,469 to 16,897,383.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 68.8% to 72.1%.
- The percentage of voters who have declined to state their political party affiliation increased from 18.3% to 20.1%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party decreased from 81.2% to 79.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 42.7% to 44.6%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 34.6% to 30.8%.
