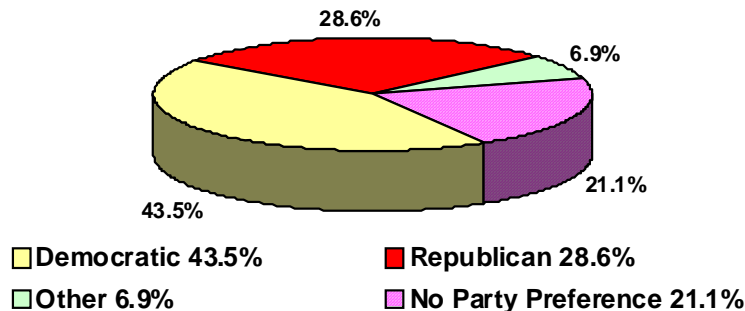

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**TRENDS**

Since the last 60-day Report of Registration for a Statewide Direct Primary in a gubernatorial election year (April 9, 2010):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 16,897,383 to 17,660,486.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 72.1% to 73.3%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 20.1% to 21.1%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party decreased from 79.2% to 76.4%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party decreased from 44.6% to 43.5%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 30.8% to 28.6%.
