

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TRENDS

Since the last 60-Day Statewide Direct Primary Report of Registration during a presidential election year (January 2, 2004):

- The total voter registration in the state has increased from 14,945,031 to 15,895,942.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who were eligible to register to vote has increased from 68.42% to 69.11%.
- The percentage number of voters who have declined to state their political party has increased from 16.2% to 19.3%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party has declined from 83.8% to 80.1%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.2% to 43.5%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party declined from 35.7% to 32.8%.
