**An Analysis of the November 1990 Statement of the Vote
Showing the Distribution of the Absent Votes by County
back to the District and City in which the Voter resides**

1. The County distributes the absent Votes back to all Districts and Cities.
Alpine, Amador, Butte, Colusa, Contra Costa, El Dorado, Glenn, Inyo, Kern, Lake, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Monterey, Nevada, Orange, Placer, Plumas, Riverside, Sacramento, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Sierra, Sonoma, Sutter, Ventura, Yolo, and Yuba.
2. The County distributes the absent Votes back to all Districts, but not to supervisor Districts or Cities.
Calaveras, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Kings, Lassen, Mendocino, Merced, Modoc, Napa, Siskiyou, Solano, Stanislaus, Tehama, and Tulare.
3. The County distributes the absent Votes back to all Districts and Cities, except to supervisor Districts.
Del Norte and Trinity.
4. The County distributes the absent Votes back to all Districts, but not to Cities.
Mono, Shasta, and Tuolumne
5. The County distributes the absent Votes back to all congressional, assembly, and equalization Districts, but only to those supervisor or senate Districts and Cities having an election of their own.
Los Angeles – **NOTE**; The City of Vernon voted entirely by absentee ballot, and so does not appear among the cities included in the Los Angeles portions of this document.
6. The County does not distribute the absent Votes back to any District or City, except equalization District, which is County-wide.
