## **Effective Date of State Ballot Measures**

"An initiative...approved by a majority of votes thereon takes effect the day after the election unless the measure provides otherwise... If provisions of 2 or more measures approved at the same election conflict, those of the measure receiving the highest affirmative vote shall prevail." California Constitution, Article II, Section 10

"A proposed [legislative] amendment or revision shall be submitted to the electors and if approved by a majority of votes thereon takes effect the day after the election unless the measure provides otherwise. If a provision of two or more measures approved at the same election conflict, those of the measure receiving the highest affirmative vote shall prevail." California Constitution, Article XVIII, Section 4

Bond proposals submitted to the electors by the Legislature and approved by a majority of votes thereon take effect the day after the election.

California Constitution, Article XVI, Section 1
