A written statement is not necessary if the vote-by-mail ballot is voted in the office of the elections official at the time of the request. The voter may designate any authorized representative to receive the ballot and return the voted vote-by-mail ballot.	§ 3021

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06/07/22	(E)	21 <b>MILITARY OR OVERSEAS VOTERS</b> Any registered military or overseas voter or any individual born outside of the United States or District of Columbia whose parent or legal guardian was a resident of California when the parent was last living in the United States who has returned to their county of registration on or before this day, and to whom a vote-by-mail ballot has been mailed but not voted, may apply to vote in the county elections official's office, vote center (Fresno County) or in a polling location (Tulare County).  An unregistered military or overseas voter who was 1) released from service after the close of registration and who has returned to their county of residence or 2) required to move under official active duty military orders after the close of registration may apply in person to register with the county elections official and vote in the election. Documentary proof of release from service or official military orders are required. On the first day a vote center opens (Fresno County) or before the day of the election (Tulare County), the county elections official shall deliver to the precinct board a list of military or overseas voters registered under Elections Code section 3108.  A military or overseas voter or any individual born outside of the United States or District of Columbia whose parent or legal guardian was a resident of California when the parent was last living in the United States who returns to the county after May 31, 2022 (E-7), may appear before the county elections official and apply for registration, a vote-by-mail ballot, or both. 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06/14/22	(E+7)	28 <b>MAILED VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS — LAST DAY TO BE COUNTED</b> Any vote-by-mail ballot cast shall be deemed timely if it is received by the elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than seven days after Election Day and either of the following is satisfied if: 1) the ballot is postmarked on or before Election Day or is time stamped or date stamped by a bona fide private mail delivery company on or before Election Day, or 2) if the ballot has no postmark, a postmark with no date, or an illegible postmark, the vote-by-mail ballot identification envelope is date stamped by the elections official upon receipt of the vote-by-mail ballot from the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company, and is signed and dated pursuant to Section 3011 on or before Election Day.	§§ 3017, 3020

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\* Elections Code section 3114 and the federal MOVE Act require that ballots and ballot materials be transmitted to each military and overseas voter no later than 45 days prior to an election. E-45 is April 23, 2022, which is a Saturday; this deadline must be adhered to and does not move forward to the next business day.

\*\* Date falls on a weekend or state holiday; it moves forward to the next business day.
