

## Justices of the California Supreme Court

An election will be held on November 4, 2014. The justices listed on the following page will stand for election to a full term of twelve years if this election coincides with the expiration of their term. If not standing for a full term, the term for which they are running is noted. Cal. Const., art. VI, § 16(a)

Justices of the California Supreme Court may file a declaration of candidacy to succeed to the office presently held by the justice. This declaration is filed between July 17, 2014, and August 15, 2014. If the declaration is not filed, the Governor, before September 16, 2014, shall nominate a candidate. At the next general election, only the candidate so declared or nominated may appear on the ballot. Cal. Const., art. VI, § 16(d)(1); § 8201<sup>1</sup>

The declaration of candidacy may be in the form of a letter, may be on office stationery, must say that the justice is a candidate to succeed himself or herself, and must be signed by the justice. Unless instructed otherwise, the Secretary of State will certify the candidate's name as signed on the declaration of candidacy.

In addition to filing the declaration, each justice must pay a nonrefundable filing fee of two percent of the first year's salary for the office. §§ 8103(a)(1), 8105(a)

In lieu of paying the filing fee, each justice may submit a petition containing signatures of 10,000 registered voters. The signatures submitted may cover all or a prorated portion of the filing fee. That portion of the filing fee not covered by signatures must be paid in full before the declaration of candidacy may be filed. §§ 8105(a), 8106(a)(3) & (b)(3)

Each justice may obtain the petition for signatures in lieu of the filing fee from the appropriate county elections official from June 2, 2014, through July 31, 2014. The last day to file these petitions is July 31, 2014. Any registered voter may sign such a petition for any and for each justice. If the petition is circulated in more than one county, the justice shall submit the signatures to the county elections official of the county in which the petition was circulated. § 8106(b)(1), (b)(3) & (b)(4)

**NOTE:** If a justice who will appear on the ballot does not receive any campaign contributions and the only expenditure made will be the justice's personal funds for the filing fee, then the justice is not required to file Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Forms 410 and 501. However, any justice who will appear on the ballot must file campaign disclosure statements. ## Justices of the California Supreme Court—Terms of Office

*A justice is either nominated to a 12-year term or appointed to fill a portion of a 12-year term as a result of a vacancy.*

*Following a nomination by the governor and confirmation by the Commission on Judicial Appointments (COJA), a nominee will appear on the ballot at the next gubernatorial election for voter approval and then must go before the voters for a retention election at the end of every 12-year term.*

*Following an appointment by the governor and confirmation by COJA, an appointee will serve as a justice until they are eligible to be a judicial candidate at the next gubernatorial election. Thereafter, the justice must go before the voters for a retention election at the end of every 12-year term.*

*The justices or nominees highlighted in bold will appear on the November 4, 2014, ballot for either retention or approval.*

\* The nominee must be confirmed by the Commission on Judicial Appointments (COJA) before he or she can appear on the November 4, 2014, General Election ballot. The COJA hearing is scheduled to be held on August 28, 2014. The nominee is not required to file a declaration of candidacy or filing fee. Once elected, the justice's term will be from January 5, 2015, to January 4, 2027.

An election will be held on November 4, 2014. The justices listed on the following pages will stand for election to a full term of twelve years if this election coincides with the expiration of their term. If not standing for a full term, the term for which they are running is noted.

Cal. Const., art. VI, § 16(a)

Justices of the California Courts of Appeal may file a declaration of candidacy to succeed to the office presently held by the justice. This declaration is filed between July 17, 2014, and August 15, 2014. If the declaration is not filed, the Governor, before September 16, 2014, shall nominate a candidate. At the next general election, only the candidate so declared or nominated may appear on the ballot.

Cal. Const., art. VI, § 16(d)(1); § 8201<sup>1</sup>

The declaration of candidacy may be in the form of a letter, may be on office stationery, must say that the justice is a candidate to succeed himself or herself, and must be signed by the justice. Unless instructed otherwise, the Secretary of State will certify the candidate's name as signed on the declaration of candidacy.

In addition to filing the declaration, each justice must pay a nonrefundable filing fee of one percent of the first year's salary for the office.

§§ 8103(a)(2), 8105(a)

In lieu of paying the filing fee, each justice may submit a petition containing signatures of 8,184 registered voters. The signatures submitted may cover all or a prorated portion of the filing fee. That portion of the filing fee not covered by signatures must be paid in full before the declaration of candidacy may be filed.

§§ 8105(a), 8106(a)(4) & (b)(3)

Each justice may obtain the petition for signatures in lieu of the filing fee from the appropriate county elections official from June 2, 2014, through July 31, 2014. The last day to file these petitions is July 31, 2014. Any registered voter may sign such a petition for a justice for whom he or she is eligible to vote. If the petition is circulated in more than one county, the justice shall submit the signatures to the county elections official of the county in which the petition was circulated.

§ 8106(b)(1), (b)(3) & (b)(4)

Once elected, the justice's term will be from January 5, 2015, to January 4, 2027.
