California Students Vote Project Overview

California Students Vote Project

Established in 2016, the California Secretary of State (SOS) Students Vote Project (SVP) is a statewide nonpartisan program that elevates college student voices and promotes civic engagement efforts to build a more inclusive democracy. Through the creation of the Students Vote Project, California was the first state in the nation to build partnerships across the state's major higher education systems to empower college students to participate in the democratic process. Program objectives include increasing college student voter education, voter registration, and outreach. The SVP achieves these objectives by hosting civic engagement events, creating educational resources, and partnering with campuses and outreach organizations. One civic engagement event that occurs during statewide election years is the California University and College Ballot Bowl. Created in 2018, the Ballot Bowl is a friendly competition where all California higher education systems can compete to register the most students to vote.

Student Civic and Voter Empowerment Act (SCVEA)

In 2019, the Student Civic and Voter Empowerment Act (<u>California Education</u> <u>Code §66850-66852</u>; <u>California Elections Code §2148.5</u>) was enacted to give California colleges and universities the necessary tools to increase civic engagement and participation among young voters. In 2020, the California Secretary of State Students Vote Project was expanded to support and ensure implementation of the landmark law. The law requires the California SOS to work directly with the California Community Colleges (CCCs) and California State Universities (CSUs) to increase college student voter registration. Colleges and universities are encouraged to participate in SVP civic learning opportunities to receive and distribute voter education resources. While the University of California (UC) and the Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities (AICCU) campuses are not required to participate, they continue to be strong partners and supporters of student civic engagement.

Key Dates and Information

- Monday, February 5: No later than this date, county elections officials shall begin mailing each registered voter a vote-by-mail ballot
- **Monday, February 5:** Counties offer early voting sites to find a location and available times, please visit https://caearlyvoting.sos.ca.gov
- Tuesday, February 20: Last day to register online or by mail ahead of the Primary Election
- Wednesday, February 21 Tuesday, March 5: Same Day Voter Registration is available; voters can "conditionally" register and vote at a county elections office or polling location after the voter registration deadline, up to and including Election Day
- Tuesday, February 27: Last day for county elections officials to send a registered voter a vote-by-mail ballot
- Tuesday, March 5: Election Day (last day to vote) polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.





Voter Checklist



Update Your Voter Registration

- Every active registered voter will receive a vote-by-mail ballot for the 2024 Presidential Primary Election
- Check or update your voter registration information as early as possible at https://registertovote.ca.gov/?t=s
 to ensure your vote-by-mail ballot is sent to the correct address



Choose How You Will Vote

- Voting by Mail: This is a secure and safe way to return your ballot
- Voting in Person: In-person locations offer important resources such as Same Day Voter Registration, ADA accommodations, replacement ballots, and other support in various languages



Identify When and Where You Will Vote

- Early in Person: Counties in California will be offering early in-person voting opportunities; visit https://caearlyvoting.sos.ca.gov to find your nearest polling location
- Early by Mail: Sign and mail your ballot as soon as you complete it; completed vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day
- **Secured Drop Box:** The secure drop box shall be clearly and visibly marked as an "Official Ballot Drop Box" that shows language stating that tampering with the drop box is a felony
- **Election Day:** Voting Locations will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, March 5, 2024; if you are in line by the closing time, then you have a right to vote
