










VoteCal System Development Lifecycle









VoteCal Web Application Project Phases


- Design Phase The design of the VoteCal system (including VoteCal browser app, EMS Remediation, public website, overall infrastructure, etc.) is developed to describe what the system will do and how it will do it.
- **Development Phase** The VoteCal system is constructed in accordance with the design.
- Testing Phase The VoteCal system is tested to make sure it works as designed.
- Pilot Deployment and Testing Phase The VoteCal system is deployed to a select number of counties to trial deployment and support.
- **Deployment and Cutover -** The VoteCal system is deployed to the remaining counties.
- First Year of Operations The operational system is closely monitored during the first year of operations







VoteCal Project Timeline










Design Phase: Progressive Elaboration



Progressive Elaboration is used to first identify the universe, and secondarily complete all of the detail needed for Development.

Key Activities / Dates for EMS Remediation

Specifications

- By June 2010
- Documenting system updates and business rules

Remediation

- June Dec 2010
- Modifying the code to align with VoteCal requirements

Data Standardization

 Aligning the data to VoteCal data standards (Statewide standards and translation, Potential for county-level data scrubbing)

Testing

Testing remediation modifications independently and with VoteCal

Training and Deployment

 Training users and deploying the modified EMS for county use (Potential for phased rollout, Broader training than VoteCal)







Testing Phases

Fall 2010 - Spring 2011

Unit Testing

Verifying that individual units of source code are fit for use

System Testing

 Verifying that the complete, integrated system(s) complies with its specified requirements

Integration Testing

 Verifying that the combination of individual software modules function appropriately

Spring 2011

Acceptance Testing Verifying the system meets QA, confidence, and validation standards

Spring 2011 – Summer 2011

Pilot Testing

 Verifying that the system works in live environments for select counties







Training Phases

Spring 2011

VoteCal Pilot and SOS Training

- Attendees: Select staff from Pilot counties and SOS
- •Training the first users of the system

EMS Remediation Pilot Training

- Attendees: Pilot counties all staff
- •Training users on the modifications to the EMS systems

Post-Pilot Updates

•Feedback from pilot deployments to adjust statewide

Summer 2011 – Fall 2011

VoteCal Statewide (Regional) Training

- •Attendees: Select staff from all remaining counties
- Statewide rollout of VoteCal Training

EMS Remediation Pilot Training

- Attendees: All counties
- •Training users on the modifications to the EMS systems

Implementation Phases

Readiness Checklists

- Starts 60-90 days prior to Implementation
- Creating and verifying that the system is ready for deployment

Pilot

- Spring 2011
- Deploying the system to selected counties to work in a live environment with actual data

Regional Rollout


- Summer Fall 2011
- Deploying the system to groups of counties to work in live environments with actual data
