Persons with a Prior Felony Conviction

### You have voting rights!



### You can register and vote if you are:





Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



18 years old or older on Election Day



Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony

#### If you meet these requirements, you can vote even if you:

- Have a misdemeanor conviction (a misdemeanor will never prevent you from voting)
- Are on parole or probation
- Are on post-release community supervision (PRCS)
