**OFFICIAL TITLE AND SUMMARY (SAME AS ON PETITION)**

**The Attorney General of California has prepared the following circulating title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:**

(22-0005.) REFERENDUM CHALLENGING 2022 LAW AUTHORIZING CREATION OF COUNCIL TO SET MINIMUM WAGE AND WORKING STANDARDS FOR FAST-FOOD WORKERS. If the required number of registered voters sign this petition and it is timely filed, a 2022 law will not take effect unless approved at the next statewide general or special election after November 8, 2022. The challenged law:

- Authorizes creation of Fast Food Council (upon submission of 10,000 fast-food worker signatures) to set working standards and minimum wage (up to \$22/hour in 2023, with capped annual increases) at fast-food restaurants with 100+ nationwide locations;
- Prohibits retaliation against fast-food workers for making certain workplace complaints.
