RE: Language Accessibility Advisory Committee: Actions from the April 3, 2024, Meeting

During the meeting the members discussed committee goals for the 2024 - 2025 term. The following are action items that the committee determined to research:

- 1. Coordinating outreach efforts between state and county LAACs.
- 2. Paying reviewers for their time working on the Voter Information Guide (VIG) and other translated materials.
- 3. Reviewing the outcomes of the No Party Preference/Presidential Primary mailers issued by the counties prior to the March 5, 2024, Presidential Primary Election.
- 4. Studying the relationship between the geography of counties and the language services provided by the county Registrar of Voters (ROVs).
- Reviewing goals left in progress by the 2023 LAAC.

- 6. Obtaining more resources for county outreach programs and for the translation of election materials.
- 7. Explore the use of best practice guides to ensure consistency in voting materials and outreach efforts throughout the state.
- 8. Explore and evaluate various translation tools (i.e. video or audio relay) to find the best technological solutions to issues facing alternative language voters.
- 9. Reviewing the bilingual poll workers survey from the previous LAAC and prepare to reissue the survey to poll workers who served in the recent March 5, 2024, Presidential Primary Election.
- 10. Researching methods of providing a central language resource for deaf and hard of hearing voters. Note: It was mentioned that this issue might be more suited for the Voter Accessibility Advisory Committee (VAAC), but it may be discussed further by the LAAC.
- 11. Exploring best practices that can be recommended to SOS regarding issues that may be present during the November 5, 2024, General Election.
