RE: Language Accessibility Advisory Committee: Request for Applications -
Deadline Extended

The Secretary of State is calling for volunteers to serve as committee members on the Language Accessibility Advisory Committee (LAAC) for the January 2026 - December 2027 term. The committee was established pursuant to Elections Code section 2600, and the mission of the LAAC is to advise and assist the Secretary of State's office with a robust language access program designed to assist voters with limited-English proficiency so that they can participate fully in the electoral process. This includes activities to support the implementation of federal and state laws related to language accessibility, making recommendations regarding programs and policy, and the review of translated material for accuracy. The committee will consist of at least 15 members; of these, at least three will be county elections officials. Members have demonstrated language accessibility experience, knowledge of methods for presenting election materials in plain language, ability to support outreach efforts to the public, and willingness to dedicate no fewer than 20 hours per year to LAAC meetings and activities for a term of two years. Additionally, members may be asked to share information with communities they are affiliated with. LAAC members are volunteers and serve at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

LAAC meetings will be held at minimum four times per year and will require a quorum to take formal actions or make recommendations. Members are expected to stay for the entire duration of meetings to maintain quorum. The meetings will be held at a publicly accessible site in Sacramento. Meetings will also be available to the members, and the public via videoconference. If members are joining remotely, they must remain on video unless technologically impractical.

Each meeting will require at least one member to be physically present at a designated publicly accessible meeting location specified in that meeting notice and agenda.

Members also have the option to host a teleconference meeting site if it is physically accessible for the public to attend.

The application deadline has been extended to January 9, 2026, and appointments will be announced February 2026. Applicants who have already applied for this term do not need to reapply. Minimum Qualifications

Applicants must meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 1) Must have demonstrated language accessibility experience, knowledge of presenting election material in plain language, or experience working within a specific language minority community.

OR

Be a county elections official or a designee of such an official.

- 2) Must be able to attend regular meetings at either in person in Sacramento or one of the designated publicly accessible locations, or via videoconference, and stay for the duration of the meeting.
- 3) Willingness to dedicate no fewer than 20 hours per year to LAAC meetings and activities.
- 4) Must serve a minimum of two years.

Desirable Qualifications

- 1) Experience working or volunteering in diverse communities, particularly those within language minority communities.
- 2) Experience as a bilingual poll worker or providing language assistance.
- 3) Experience in translations services.
- 4) Demonstrated experience in voting rights policy.
- 5) Demonstrated experience representing language minority communities.
- 6) Demonstrated experience with voter education, outreach, and engagement efforts, particularly within language minority communities.
- 7) Demonstrated experience in policy analysis, development, and advocacy.

The Secretary of State intends to develop a diverse applicant pool and subsequently appoint a diverse committee. Please share this announcement with your communities including bilingual poll workers, organizational leadership, and experienced volunteers.
