RE: Voting Accessibility Advisory Committee: Request for Applications -
Deadline Extended

The Secretary of State is calling for volunteers to serve as committee members on the Voting Accessibility Advisory Committee (VAAC) for the January 2026 - December 2027 term. The mission of the VAAC is to advise, assist, and provide recommendations to the Secretary of State's office regarding the implementation of federal and state laws relating to access to the electoral process, so every registered voter can vote independently and privately. The VAAC membership consists of three county elections officials and five representatives from the disability community who demonstrate an interest and involvement in issues related to voting accessibility and willingness to dedicate no fewer than 20 hours per year to VAAC meetings and activities for a term of two years. Additionally, members may be asked to share information with communities they are affiliated with. VAAC members are volunteers and serve at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

VAAC meetings will be held at minimum four times per year and will require a quorum to take formal actions or make recommendations. Members are expected to stay for the entire duration of meetings to maintain quorum. The meetings will be held at publicly accessible sites in Sacramento and other regions as necessary. Meetings will also be available to the public via videoconference. All members participating remotely must remain visible on video unless technologically impractical.

Each meeting will require at least one member to be physically present at a designated publicly accessible meeting location specified in that meeting's notice and agenda. Members also have the option to host a teleconference meeting site if it is physically accessible for the public to attend.

The application deadline has been extended to January 9, 2026, and appointments will be announced February 2026. Applicants who have already applied for this term do not need to reapply. Minimum Qualifications

Applicants must meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 1) Must demonstrate an interest and involvement in issues related to voting accessibility.

OR

Be a county elections official or a designee of such an official.

- 2) Must be able to attend regular meetings in Sacramento or one of the designated publicly accessible locations, or via videoconference, and stay for the duration of the meeting.
- 3) Willingness to dedicate no fewer than 20 hours per year to VAAC meetings and activities.
- 4) Must serve a minimum of two years.

Desirable Qualifications

- 1) Experience working or volunteering in diverse communities, particularly those with respect to voting accessibility.
- 2) Demonstrated experience in voting rights policy.
- 3) Demonstrated experience representing voters with disabilities.
- 4) Demonstrated experience with voter education, outreach, and engagement efforts, particularly with respect to voting accessibility.
- 5) Demonstrated experience in policy analysis, development, and advocacy.

The Secretary of State's goal is to have a diverse applicant pool and subsequently appoint a diverse committee. Please share this announcement with your communities including poll workers, organizational leadership, and experienced volunteers.
