RE: Primary Election: Logic and Accuracy Test Reporting -
ACTION REQUIRED

No later than seven (7) days prior to any election, the elections official shall provide public notice pursuant to (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2 § 20876(d)) and conduct a test or series of tests to ensure that every device used to tabulate ballots accurately records each vote, henceforth referred to as logic and accuracy testing. The exact methods employed in this test shall conform to the voting procedures for the specific voting systems, as adopted by the Secretary of State, pursuant to (Elec. Code, § 15000). The method(s) and equipment used to produce ballots for this test shall replicate, in all material aspects and without deviation, the jurisdiction's vote-by-mail and in-person ballot production process used for this election.

Additionally, during logic and accuracy testing, jurisdictions approved to use a ballot on demand system shall also produce test ballots printed from its system to establish that the system is configured, calibrated, and performing as intended (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2 § 20279). The ballot on demand test ballots shall be scanned, tabulated, and the accuracy verified on each type of voting system component to be used in the election.

Further, before utilization of an electronic poll book for any election, the elections official shall verify and document the readiness of each electronic poll book prior to its use (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2 § 20165).

The Secretary of State's office requests jurisdictions provide confirmation that a logic and accuracy test was conducted in accordance with state law. To facilitate this request, our office has provided the attached template.
