Method used to choose precincts and batch of ballots to manually tally (include description of random selection method):

To count vote center ballots, precincts numbers were randomly selected using the Election Management System One Percent Random Sample Report.

To count vote by mail ballots, each batch number was printed on a slip of paper, placed in a container, then selected by random draw until requisite number of ballots were counted. A full count for all contests was conducted for the San Andreas Vote Center ballots cast which included multiple precincts. The remaining manual count focused on local contests. 

Description of discrepancies noted during manual tally:

1) San Andreas Vote Center Ballots Cast Discrepancies:

Contest Affected	Discrepancy	Ballot Type
State Senator District 4	Two ballots were overvoted, however the voters made clear notes on each ballot noting they intended to vote in favor of Marie-Alvarado Gil. During the manual count it was determined they both should have been votes for Marie Alvarado Gil. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	110-001 220-004
Associate Justice Goodwin Liu	The ballot scanner read and counted two ballots as overvotes. The "no" box was filled in completely. During the manual count, it was determined appeared both voters intended to vote "no." This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	310-008 450-012
Associate Justice Joshua Groban	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as a "no" vote. During the manual count, it was determined that the voter's intent was to leave the contest unvote. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	210-001
CUSD TA4	One ballot was marked using a red pen. The red pen was not readable by the ballot scanner and was counted as an undervote. During the manual count it was determined it should have been a vote for Suzie Coe. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	110-001
Proposition 29	One ballot was marked using a red pen. The red pen was not readable by the ballot scanner, and was counted as an undervote. During the manual count it was determined it should have been a "yes" vote. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	110-001
Proposition 31	The ballot scanner read and counted two ballots as overvotes. During the manual count it was determined the voters intended to vote "no", however the ballots were recorded as an overvote. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	260-001
Measure A	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as an overvote. During the manual count it was determined the voter intended to vote "yes.". This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	260-001
Measure A	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as an overvote. During the manual count it was determined the voter intended to vote "no." This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	150-004

Vallecito Union School District	The ballot scanner read and counted a vote for Amanda Monaco. During the manual count it was determined it should have been counted as an undervote. This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	360-009
Ebbetts Pass Veterans Memorial District- Full Term	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as an overvote. One ballot has slight mark in the box for James Carlon. The boxes for Don Padou and James McGee were completely filled in.. During the manual count it was determined it should have been a vote for Don Padou and James McGee. The results were updated manually to reflect the voter's intent.	310-008
Ebbetts Pass Veterans Memorial District- Full Term	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as an overvote. The voter completely filled in both boxes for James Carlon and James McGee. There is a pen mark in the box for Don Padou. During the manual count it was determined it should have been a voter for James Carlon and Jams McGee. The results were updated manually to reflect the voter's intent.	360-008
Proposition 31	The ballot scanner read and counted one ballot as an overvote. During the manual count it was determined the voter intended to vote "no." This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	310-008
Mark Twain Union Elementary School District	The ballot scanner read and counted a vote for Timothy Randall. During the manual count it was determined it should have been counted as an undervote This did not impact the outcome of the contest results; therefore, manual changes were not made to the results.	430-001
