Method used to choose precincts and batch of ballots to manually tally (include description of random selection method):

Two-part method: Select 1% of in-person precincts and 1% of vote-by-mail ballots. Election workers and observers rolled four 10-sided dice in combination with a dice bin (created using <https://votingworks.github.io/dicebins/dicebins.html>) to randomly select batches of VBM ballots until the number of required ballots was reached. Then they rolled three 10-sided dice in combination with another dice bin to randomly select the 4 required precincts. The same method was then used with individualized dice bins targeting specific races, until every contest was included within both parts of the tally.


Description of any discrepancies noted (include details about each discrepancy and how each was resolved; also include anything unusual observed during the manual tally process or anything that may improve the manual tally process):

After further review, a vote on Proposition 31 that was originally deemed to be an overvote was determined to be a yes vote, a vote for CA Secretary of State that was originally deemed to be an overvote was determined to be a vote for Rob Bernosky, a vote on Proposition 26 that was originally deemed to be a yes vote was determined to be a no vote, and 2 votes for Millbrae City Council, District 4 that were originally deemed to be undervotes were determined to be votes for certified write-in candidate Dzuong (Bob) Trung Nguyen. All of the above ballots were re-adjudicated and the official count was corrected accordingly.

Public is Encouraged to Observe the Audit Process

(Redwood City, CA) Mark Church, Chief Elections Officer & Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder announced today that on Monday, November 14, 2022, at 9:00 a.m., the San Mateo County Registration & Elections Division will begin the One Percent Manual Tally of the votes cast in the November 8, 2022 Statewide General Election.

The One Percent Manual Tally is a legally required election canvassing procedure that takes place after the polls have closed on Election Day. This process ensures the accuracy of the vote before the official results are certified.

The procedure begins with the randomized selection of precincts from Vote Centers and batches of Vote by Mail ballots. Selection is determined through a dice roll using three to four ten-sided dice and matching the resulting three to four numbers to a corresponding precinct number or Vote by Mail batch. For each contest not included in the One Percent Manual Tally, an additional voting precinct or batch with that contest will be tallied.

The One Percent Manual Tally, including the rolling of the dice, is open to the public. The rolling of the dice will be livestreamed on our Twitter page @smcvote. Past observers have rolled the dice to help select the precincts and the batches.

Election officials will work in teams of four, called a "tally team," to manually read, call out, record and tally votes by hand. This process will take approximately one to two weeks to complete.

The Chief Elections Officer will then certify and publish the official results no later than December 8, 2022. The official certified results, known as the Statement of the Vote, will be published on www.smcacre.org.

The One Percent Manual Tally will be held at the Registration & Elections Division at 40 Tower Road in San Mateo.
