Random.org is a random choice generator that is used to determine the batches of ballots that will be included in the manual tally process. 1) A spreadsheet is prepared listing the total number of batches processed. 2) Each batch is then assigned with a sequential number (1,2,3...) This is the sampling frame (the list used to draw a simple random sample). 3) Random.org is then used to select the sample using the sampling frame from Step 2 to conclude the random selection for the 1% manual tally process.

Qualifications of candidates for County Board of Education: Any registered voter residing within the Trustee Area is eligible except the county superintendent of schools, any member of his or her staff, or any employee of a school district pursuant to Section 1006 of the Education Code.

A candidate for community college and school districts must be a registered voter residing within the district pursuant to Sections 35107 & 72103 of the Education Code.

A candidate for director of Community Services Districts shall be a registered voter residing within the boundaries of the district pursuant to Section 61040 of the Government Code.

A candidate for commissioner of the Oxnard Harbor District must be a registered voter residing within the district pursuant to Section 6053 of the Harbors & Navigation Code.

A candidate for director of the Camarillo Health Care District must be a registered voter residing in the district pursuant to Section 32100 of the Health and Safety Code.

A candidate for council member of any Municipal Advisory Council must be a registered voter residing within the division of the council area pursuant to Section 201 of the Elections Code.

A candidate for director of any Municipal Water District shall be a resident of the division from which he/she is elected pursuant to Sections 71250 and 71501 of the Water Code.

A candidate for director of any Recreation and Park District must be a qualified voter of the district pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5784(c).

A candidate for director of any Sanitary District must be a resident elector of the division from which he/she is elected pursuant to Section 6464 of the Health and Safety Code and the Sanitary Act of 1923.

A candidate for director of the Triunfo Water and Sanitation District must be a registered voter residing in the district pursuant to Section 4730.1 of the Health and

Safety Code and Section 201 of the Elections Code.

A candidate for director of the Santa Clarita Valley Water Agency must be an elector of the Agency or division, if applicable, pursuant to Section 103-3 of the Water Code Appendix.

A candidate for director of the United Water Conservation District shall be an elector of the division from which he/she is elected, a qualified elector of the district, and resident of the county pursuant to Sections 74091 and 74200 of the Water Code.

A candidate for the Blanchard/Santa Paula Public Library District must be a registered voter residing within the district pursuant to Education Code Section 18342.

Official nomination documents for eligible candidates desiring to file for any of the elective offices may be obtained beginning Monday, July 18, 2022 from either the District Office or from the County of Ventura, Office of the County Clerk, Elections Division, Hall of Administration, Lower Plaza, 800 South Victoria Avenue, Ventura. Nomination documents must be filed with the Ventura County Elections Division, Office of the County Clerk, no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, August 12, 2022.

If nomination papers for an incumbent elective officer of a district are not filed by the aforementioned deadline, the voters shall have until 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 17, 2022, to nominate candidates other than the incumbent of such office.

Appointment to each elective office will be made as prescribed by Section 10515 of the Elections Code in the event that:

A. There are no nominees or an insufficient number of nominees for such office(s) and

B. A petition signed by 10% of the voters or 50 voters in the district, whichever is the smaller number, requesting that an election be held has not been presented by 5:00 p.m. on August 17, 2022.

Pursuant to Elections Code Section 12112, the ballots of the precincts of Ventura County will be counted at a

Central Counting Place,
County of Ventura, Hall of
Administration, Elections
Division, 800 South Victoria
Avenue, Ventura, and shall
be open to the public.

The Vote Centers will be
open between the hours of
10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
starting Saturday, October
29 through Monday, Novem-
ber 7, 2022. The Vote Cen-
ters will be open 7:00 a.m.
to 8:00 p.m. on Election
Day, November 8, 2022.
