The Solano County Registrar of Voters issued public notice for random draw of the 1 Percent Manual Tally per EC 15360 with the random selection to commence Thursday June 16th, at 11:00 a.m. Three observers from the public attended. The audit was conducted continuously from Thursday morning until Tuesday morning until all precincts and batches were completed.

Three polling places were randomly drawn for complete manual tally. A total of 7 precincts out of 213, comprised of 3 poll places out of 68 were selected. The manual tally confirmed the machine counts for all precinct ballots as follows:

Solano county utilized batches of up to 250 ballots to count vote by mail ballots. Fifteen batches were initially randomly drawn, plus one extra to ensure all contests were audited. For each original batch, all races on the ballots were audited. The manual tally confirmed the machine counts for vote by mail ballots as follows:

Overall, 7 of 213 precincts (3.2%) and 15 of 648 vote by mail batches (2.3%) were manually audited, representing 1,810 of 70,106 vote by mail ballots cast (for 2.5%). In each case, the hand count of ballots matched the machine count produced on election night.
