Most discrepancies were found during adjudication which were voter errors. They would cross out a voter and circle the one they really wanted and those were resolved at that time. During the manual tally process we found a ballot that had marked a candidate as being voted for, but it was just the way the fold had hit that candidate's oval as they hadn't really been voted for. I found that ballot in the ballot review screen and adjusted it.

## **RE: March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary Election 1% manual tally pursuant to Election Code Section 15360(e)**

I, STEPHANIE WELLEMEYER, Registrar of Voters, County of Modoc, State of California, do hereby certify that on March 11-15, 2024 a one percent manual tally was conducted and completed in conjunction with the March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary Election.

California Election Code requires each local election official to conduct a manual count of all contests on ballots cast in a randomly selected one percent of the Election Day voting precincts in order to verify the accuracy of the machine count. This manual tally occurs during the 28-day voter-canvassing period prior to official certification of election results to demonstrate the integrity of the vote tabulation system.

This report addresses the manual count to machine count comparison of a randomly selected one percent of the ES&S DS200 scanner and Expressvote units deployed on Election Day.

With 21 precincts, Modoc County would need to randomly select 0.21 precincts, in which case we canvass 1 whole precinct. However, we always choose one precinct each from mail ballot only precincts and a vote-by-mail/polling precinct. The randomly selected precincts were Precincts #160 & #320. In order to account for all races that appeared on the ballot two additional precinct were selected: Precinct #200 & 260. One discrepancy was found and amended.

An election notice was published in the legal section of the newspaper to comply with the notice requirements. The entire manual tally was conducted in public view by hand without the use of electronic equipment. Lastly, the entire manual tally process was completed prior to certification of the Election.
