Each batch number was printed on a slip of paper which were put into plastic bowls. People then drew from the plastic bowls to draw the batches to be tallied. We did an initial draw to make sure that all contests were represented. We needed to pull a few more batches in order to get all contests represented.

The same method was used to randomly draw batches for ballots tallied after Election Night (this is what included the provisional and same day registration ballots).

Description of any discrepancies noted (include details about each discrepancy and how each was resolved; also include anything unusual observed during the manual tally process or anything that may improve the manual tally process):

There were no discrepancies noted during the tally that would be attributed to anything other than new people doing the task. The manual tally is not for everyone and with a fair number of new people to our office, there were some growing pains as people learned a new task. For some it was an adjustment and for others we learned the manual tally was not for them. We had to re-tally several batches because the results didn't match (something we would normally do), but there were no discrepancies in the two counts upon the re-tally. It was usually someone reading wrong, hearing wrong, or marking the wrong name on the tally sheet.
