Method used to choose precincts and batch of ballots to manually tally (include description of random selection method):

Batches were numbered sequentially, 1-338, for VBM and 1-36 for Vote Center counted on Election Night. An on-line random number generator was used to select 3 numbers within the range of Vote By Mail ballots and 3 numbers within the range of Election Night ballots. The random selections were 117, 189, and 250 (VBM) and 7, 15, 34 (VC). Three additional Vote By Mail batches were added to ensure all districts were included in the manually tally.

Description of any discrepancies noted (include details about each discrepancy and how each was resolved; also include anything unusual observed during the manual tally process or anything that may improve the manual tally process):

Batch 101-89 (#189): A discrepancy was observed on the Treasurer contest. The initial system report reflected 1 Overvote and 22 votes for Jennifer Hawks, while the manual tally reflected zero Overvotes and 23 votes for Jennifer Hawks. A review of the ballot images confirmed that ballot card 101-89-45 was too light for tabulators to count.

Batch 103-80 (#250): A discrepancy was observed on the State Senate District 4 contest. The initial system report reflected 1 Undervote and 8 votes for Jaron Brandon, while the manual tally reflected zero undervotes and 9 votes for Jaron Brandon. A review of the ballot images confirmed that ballot card 103-80-003 was too light for tabulators to count.

Batch 202-8 (#15): Discrepancies were observed in the following contests: Governor, State Board of Equalization District 1, US Representative District 13, Member of the State Assembly District 27, Assessor, County Clerk-Recorder:

Each contest listed above included discrepancies involving the number of reported under/over votes and one or two candidates compared to the hand tally. Upon review, it was discovered that the initial summary report did not include adjudicated votes. After correcting the system settings and generating a new report, the hand tally was verified as correct for all contests.

Processing of Vote-by-Mail Ballots

- Beginning May 4, 2026 at 1:00 p.m. Vote By Mail ballots will be processed. This process will continue until completed.

Election Night Reporting, June 2, 2026

- Results from processed Vote by Mail ballots will be released shortly after 8:00 p.m. on our website at www.votemadera.com. Subsequent result updates will be released according to Elections Code.

Official Canvass

- The official canvass process for the above-named election will begin on June 4, 2026 and will continue until completed.

One Percent Manual Tally

- The random draw for the one percent manual tally of precincts will be held at 8:00 a.m. on June 3, 2026.
- The manual tally will commence on or about Thursday, June 4, 2026, and will continue each day—excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays—at 200 West 4th Street, Madera, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with breaks and lunch periods as needed.
