A random number generator, www.random.org, was used to select the consolidated precincts and vote-by-mail batches to be manually tallied.

Description of any discrepancies noted (include details about each discrepancy and how each was resolved; also include anything unusual observed during the manual tally process or anything that may improve the manual tally process):

Each Manual Tally Board had two talliers. When they noticed a discrepancy, they would re-tally that particular contest again to see if they came up with different results. Discrepancies were resolved at the conclusion of each batch.

There were two discrepancies where the voting system results were different than the results from the Manual Tally Board. In both situations, the voter had bubbled their choice tangential to the voting target which the voting system did not detect. The Manual Tally Board accepted the bubbles that were marked tangential to the voting targets as the voters' intended votes.

- There are many components to ensuring election security, transparency, and accuracy. The public is invited to observe two specific processes that support all of these things: **Logic & Accuracy Testing**, which begins April 30 at 9:00 am in the Elections Center, and the **1% Manual Tally**, which will begin June 16 at 9:00 am. LAT confirms that each of the tabulators is functioning properly prior to the election, and the 1% tally confirms by a hand count of randomly selected ballots that those results match what the tabulators have compiled.
