

# VOTING RIGHTS RESTORED

Persons with a Prior Felony Conviction

**You have voting rights!**



**You can register and vote if you are:**



A U.S. citizen and a resident of California



Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



18 years old or older on Election Day



Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony

**If you meet these requirements, you can vote even if you:**

- ▶ Have a misdemeanor conviction (a misdemeanor will never prevent you from voting)
- ▶ Are on parole or probation
- ▶ Are on post-release community supervision (PRCS)

**Register or re-register to vote today!**

If you were registered to vote and convicted of a felony, your previous registration may have been canceled.

**Have you been incarcerated? You may be eligible to vote.**

## HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE

- You may request a paper voter registration card from the Secretary of State or your county elections office.
- Voter registration cards and voting materials are available in English, Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, and Vietnamese.
- You can register to vote online at [registertovote.sos.ca.gov](https://registertovote.sos.ca.gov) or by scanning the QR Code below.

## YOUR VOTING RIGHTS

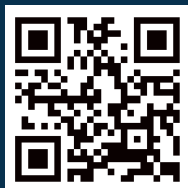
- If you are in jail and you are eligible to vote, you are entitled to receive a voter registration card.
- If you are currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony in a state prison, a federal prison or local detention facility, your right to vote is restored once you have finished serving your term.
  - Your county will send a notification confirming that you can register or reregister to vote.

## QUESTIONS AND RESOURCES

If you are unsure of what type of sentence you are serving, ask the staff at your correctional facility.
