As a VCA county, our poll workers are hired on as Extra Help County employees due to the training and hours necessary to operate our Vote Centers. In an effort to attract more bilingual workers, we started offering an immediate hire at the Step 3 pay rate in April of 2022. Much more interest was generated during the Nov 22 hiring cycle as the Step 3 incentive was promoted from the initial posting of the position.		
We are assisted with recruitment by our partners in the Community Leaders Coalition who share our job openings with their respective constituents. Many of these agencies work directly with Spanish-speaking and Tagalog-speaking communities.		
We have 2 full time staff members who are Spanish-speaking as well as 4 extra help staff (3 Spanish, 1 Tagalog) that we bring on during the pre-election period as well as on Election Day.		
Election Division staff is also supported at the main office by temporary employees throughout the pre-election period. The staffing agency knows our need for bilingual workers. We had 3 Spanish-speaking employees available for translation at the counter or over the phone.		
We do have some "traditional" poll workers who work Mail Ballots at our Drive Thrus as well as our phone b collectors as well as a Spanish-speaker on our phone
