

²Due to the delay in Census information as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic which subsequently affected the release of redistricting maps by the California Citizens Redistricting Commission, this 154-Day Report of Registration contains the number of voters, by party preferences, in each county, city, and unincorporated area. The 88-Day Report of Registration will include the number of voters, by party preferences, in each Supervisorial, State Senate, State Assembly, Board of Equalization, and Congressional District.

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TRENDS

Since the last 154-Day Report of Registration for a Statewide Direct Primary in a gubernatorial election year (January 2, 2018):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 18,980,481 to 22,005,243.
- The percentage of eligible Californians who are registered to vote increased from 75.7% to 81.6%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference decreased from 25.0% to 22.9%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party increased from 74.4% to 75.9%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 44.6% to 46.7%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 25.4% to 24.0%.

¹Since September 26, 2016, 16- and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote. Once they turn 18, they become automatically registered. Pre-registered voters may be activated before their 18th birthday if they will be 18 in an upcoming election. Those pre-registered voters were not eliminated from pre-registration statistics since they remain pre-registrants until their 18th birthday. Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.
