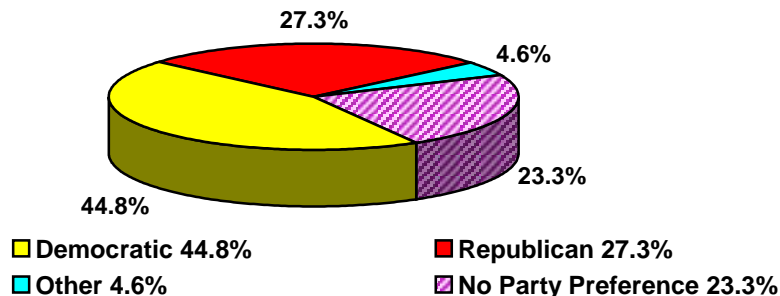

TRENDS

Since the last 15-Day Report of Registration for a primary in a presidential election year (May 21, 2012):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 17,153,699 to 17,915,053.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote decreased from 72.34% to 72.29%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 21.31% to 23.32%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party decreased from 77.73% to 76.13%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.39% to 44.82%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 30.24% to 27.29%.
