TRENDS

Since the last 15-Day Report of Registration for a general in a gubernatorial election year (October 22, 2018):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 19,696,371 to 22,057,154.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 78.2% to 88.9%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference decreased from 27.5% to 23.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party increased from 72.5% to 75.7%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.5% to 46.5%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party remained at 24.0%.

Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.
