

TRENDS

Since the last 60-Day Report of Registration for a General Election in a gubernatorial election year (September 5, 2014):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 17,634,876 to 19,086,589.
- The percentage of eligible Californians who are registered to vote increased from 72.7% to 75.8%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 23.1% to 26.8%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party decreased from 76.1% to 72.4%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.4% to 43.8%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 28.2% to 24.5%.

To accurately capture the number of voters who will be registered for the November 6, 2018, election, voters who will be 18 on Election Day but are not yet 18 are included in the active registration statistics. However, they were not eliminated from pre-registration statistics since they remain pre-registrants until their 18th birthday. Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.
