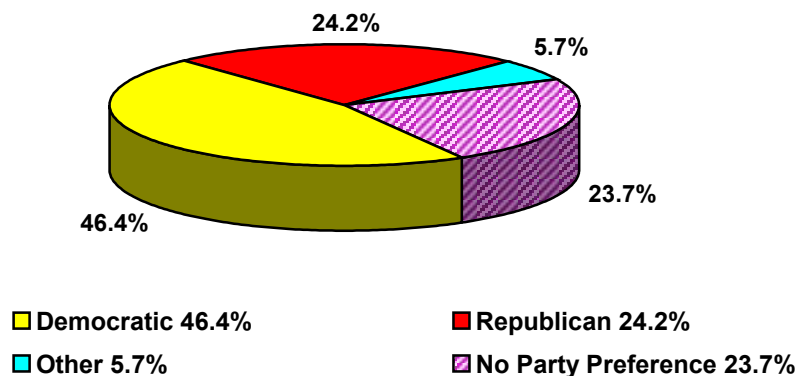

TRENDS

Since the last 60-Day Report of Registration for a general in a presidential election year (September 9, 2016):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 18,251,826 to 21,240,236.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 73.5% to 84.7%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 23.4% to 23.7.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party decreased from 76.0% to 75.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 45.2% to 46.4%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 26.8% to 24.2%.

¹Since September 26, 2016, 16- and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote. Once they turn 18, they become automatically registered. Pre-registered voters may be activated before their 18th birthday if they will be 18 in an upcoming election. Those pre-registered voters were not eliminated from pre-registration statistics since they remain pre-registrants until their 18th birthday. Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.

²Historical pre-registration totals show how many people pre-registered to vote since pre-registration began on September 26, 2016, including pre-registered voters who have since turned 18 and have become active voters.
