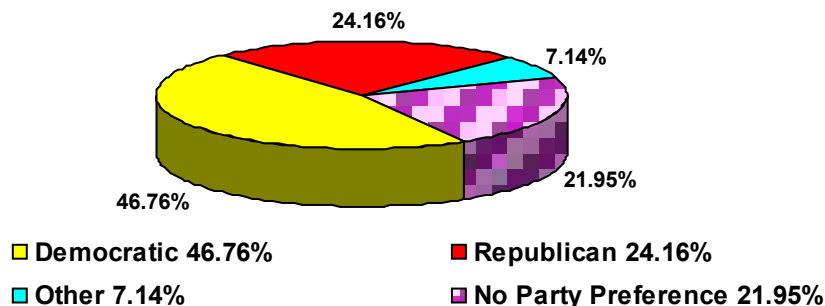
²The 2020 and 2024 presidential primary elections were held in March. The 2012 and 2016 presidential primary elections were held in June.

³The presidential and statewide direct primaries were split in 2008. The presidential primary election was held on February 5, and the statewide direct primary election was held on June 3. Therefore, by law, two 60-day reports were published.

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TRENDS

Since the last 60-Day Report of Registration for a Primary in a Presidential election year (January 3, 2020):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 20,428,270 to 22,077,412.
- The percentage of eligible Californians who are registered to vote increased from 80.95% to 82.84%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference decreased from 25.90% to 21.95%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party increased from 73.00% to 76.87%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 44.59% to 46.76%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party increased from 23.71% to 24.16%.

¹Since September 26, 2016, 16- and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote. Once they turn 18, they become automatically registered. Pre-registered voters may be activated before their 18th birthday if they will be 18 in an upcoming election. Those pre-registered voters were not eliminated from pre-registration statistics since they remain pre-registrants until their 18th birthday. Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.

²Historical pre-registration totals show how many people pre-registered to vote since pre-registration began on September 26, 2016, including pre-registered voters who have since turned 18 and have become active voters.
