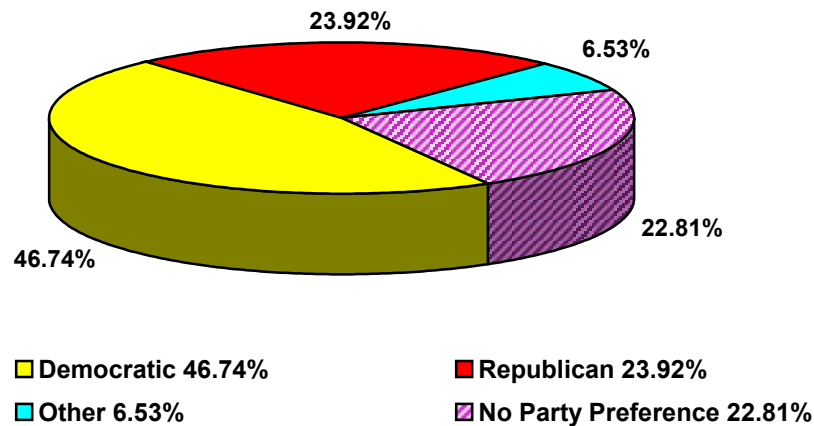

This 88-Day Report contains the number of voters, by party preferences, in each county, city, and unincorporated area, and each Supervisorial, State Senate, State Assembly, Board of Equalization, and Congressional District.

<sup>1</sup>Since September 26, 2016, 16- and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote. Once they turn 18, they become automatically registered. Pre-registered voters may be activated before their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday if they will be 18 in an upcoming election. Those pre-registered voters were not eliminated from pre-registration statistics since they remain pre-registrants until their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. Therefore, some voters are counted in both pre-registration and active registration statistics.
