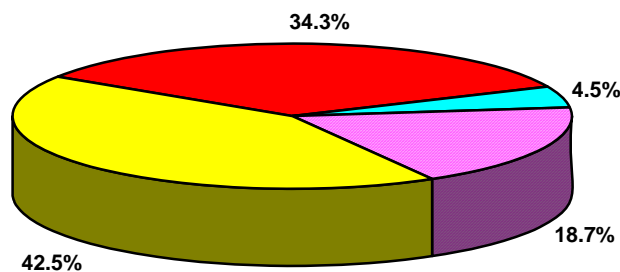

October 23, 2006 Registration Percentages



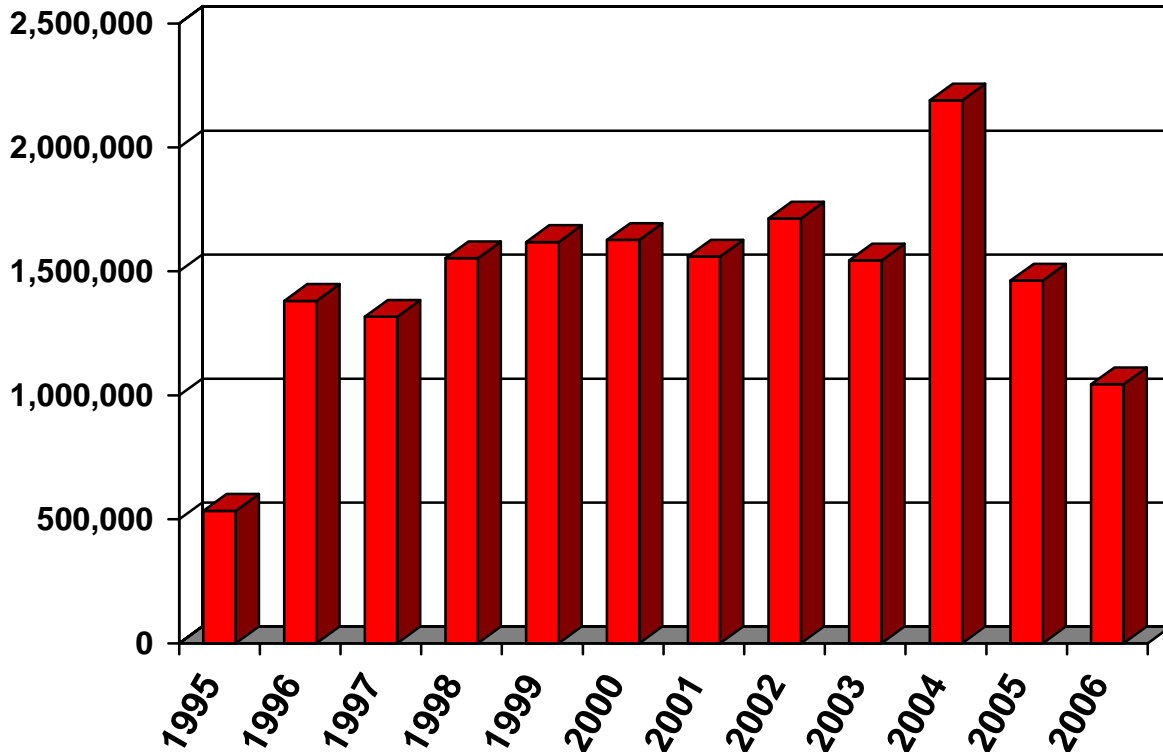

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Since last 15-day Gubernatorial General Report of Registration (October 21, 2002 Report):

- The total registration in the state has increased from 15,303,469 to 15,837,108.
- The percentage number of total registered voters compared to eligible voters has declined from 71.3% to 69.9%.
- The percentage number of voters who have “Declined to State” their political party has increased from 15.2% to 18.7%.
- The percentage registration in the qualified political parties has declined from 84.1% to 80.7%.
- The percentage registration in the Democratic Party declined from 44.6% to 42.5%.
- The percentage registration in the Republican Party declined from 35.2% to 34.3%.
- Since June 19, 1995, (when NVRA began) through August 31, 2006, 17,545,847 people have registered or reregistered to vote in conjunction with “Motor Voter.”
