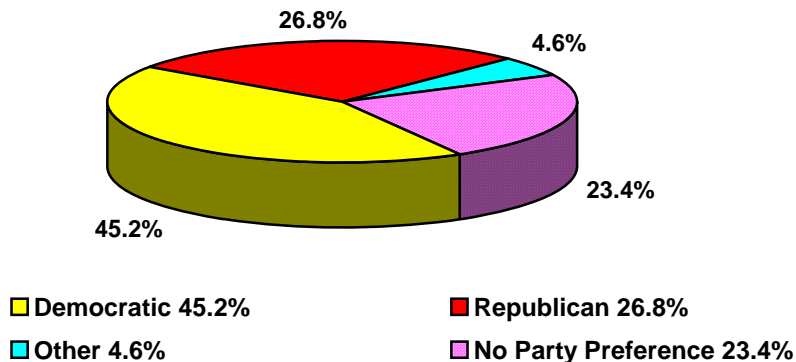

**TRENDS**

Since the last 60-Day Report of Registration for a general in a presidential election year (September 7, 2012):

- The total voter registration in the state increased from 17,259,680 to 18,251,826.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote increased from 72.6% to 73.5%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 21.3% to 23.4%.
- The percentage of voters registered with a qualified political party decreased from 77.5% to 76.0%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party increased from 43.3% to 45.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 30.1% to 26.8%.
