


REPORT OF REGISTRATION September 9, 2005

TRENDS:

Since the August 8, 2003 (60-Day) Statewide Special Election Report of Registration:

- The total registration in the state has increased from 14,995,501 to 15,839,327.
- The percentage number of total registered voters compared to eligible voters has increased from 68.8% to 70.6%.
- The percentage number of voters who have "Declined to State" their political party has increased from 15.7% to 18.0%.
- The percentage registration in the qualified political parties has declined from 83.7% to 81.5%.
- The percentage registration in the Democratic Party declined from 44.1% to 42.8%.
- The percentage registration in the Republican Party declined from 35.3% to 34.8%.
- Since June 19, 1995, (when NVRA began) through June 30, 2005, 15,770,670 people have registered or reregistered to vote in conjunction with "Motor Voter."
