

PREFACE

This Supplement to the Statement of Vote contains the official vote count results by districts and counties for the 23 presidential candidates, 15 United States Senate candidates, and 20 ballot measures that appeared on California's March 7, 2000 presidential primary election ballot.

The Supplement, produced pursuant to Elections Code section 15502, is presented in three volumes: Volumes 1 and 2 contain the vote results for the presidential candidates, including the "cross-over" vote; Volume 3 contains vote results for the United States Senate contest and the statewide ballot measures. The first report for each contest presents the statewide summary of votes cast, followed by the vote totals by political subdivision within each county, followed in turn by the results in each congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and Board of Equalization district. The district results indicate the vote cast districtwide and within each county that comprises the district.

Creating this report required an unprecedented effort on the part of my Elections Division staff. They worked hundreds of hours verifying that the data submitted by the county elections officials were accurate, working with them to resolve any discrepancies; keying the data into the Calvoter database; and proofing, re-proofing, and proofing yet again to ensure that the information presented here is as accurate as our new technology and human hands and eyes can make it. Melissa Warren, Evelyn Mendez, and their crew of dedicated student assistants have my greatest appreciation for their unsurpassed efforts to ensure that this report is of the highest quality possible.

READING THE PRESIDENTIAL RETURNS

Volumes 1 and 2 of this supplement contain the total votes cast for the 23 presidential candidates at the March 7, 2000 primary election, including the “cross-over” vote. Because this is the first presidential primary conducted under the open primary law and because of the legislative requirement to report both open primary and party preferential results for President, these results require a little explanation. For example, in the statistics reported on page 97:

Percent, Party (Open) indicates the percentage of the total county vote cast for all same-party candidates that the candidate received; i.e., in the open primary, Al Gore received 73.8% of all the votes that were cast by Alameda County voters for Democratic candidates.

Percent, Party (Party column) indicates the percentage of the total county vote that the candidate received from members of the party who voted for, in this instance, Democratic candidates; i.e., Al Gore received 70.5% of all the Alameda County American Independent votes cast for Democratic candidates.

Percent, Total (Open) indicates the percentage the candidate received of the total county vote; i.e., Al Gore received 44.1% of all the votes cast in Alameda County for president..

Percent, Total (Party column) indicates the percentage of the vote cast by members of the party indicated for all presidential candidates; i.e., Al Gore received 32.2% of all the votes cast in the presidential contest by Alameda County’s American Independent voters.

In addition, you may notice that the vote totals reported in the statewide summary reports differ slightly from those in the subsequent reports. The reason is that the summary reports are from the Statement of Vote, compiled and printed in April. Additional post-election processing and reconciliation changed those totals in some cases.
