

Information Sheet Qualifications and Requirements

Member of the State Assembly, 43rd District Special Election

The Governor issued the proclamation for a special **GENERAL** election to be held on **June 8, 2010**. The date of the special **PRIMARY** election is scheduled for **April 13, 2010**.

The date of the primary election is calculated by counting back eight Tuesdays or, if the eighth Tuesday is the day of or the day following a state holiday, nine Tuesdays preceding the day of the special general election at which the vacancy is to be filled. § 10704¹

I. QUALIFICATIONS

- A. Be a U.S. citizen.² Cal. Const., art. IV, § 2(c)
- B. Be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person. § 201
- C. Satisfy the following registration requirements:
 - 1. Be registered with the political party whose nomination he or she is seeking for not less than three months immediately prior to the time the declaration of candidacy is presented to the county elections official or, if eligible to register for less than three months, for as long as he or she has been eligible to register to vote in California. § 8001(a)
 - 2. Not have been registered as affiliated with any other qualified political party within three months immediately prior to the filing of the declaration of candidacy. § 8001(a)
- D. Not have served three terms in the State Assembly since November 6, 1990. Cal. Const., art. IV, § 2(a)

II. REQUIREMENTS

A. FILING FEES

Every candidate must pay a filing fee equal to 1% of the first year salary. Currently, the filing fee is \$952.91. The filing fee must be paid to the county elections official at the time the candidate obtains the nomination papers from the county elections official. §§ 8103(a)(3), 8105

² Article IV, section 2(c), of the California Constitution requires one year residency in the legislative district and three years residency in California; however, it is the legal opinion of this office that these provisions violate the U.S. Constitution and are unenforceable.

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A candidate may choose to submit by **February 14, 2010***, petitions-in-lieu of filing fees containing a minimum of **1,500** signatures of registered voters residing in the district.

§§ 8106(a)(1) & (b)(3), 10704(a)

The **1,500** in-lieu signature requirement applies to candidates seeking the nomination of the Democratic and Republican parties, as well as independent candidates. Candidates seeking the nomination of the American Independent, Green, Libertarian, or Peace and Freedom party may submit a petition containing, respectively, **150, 137, 104, or 76** signatures of members of their respective political party.

§§ 8106(a)(1) & (a)(6)

1. Petitions for in-lieu signatures may be obtained from the county elections official between **January 5, 2010, and February 14, 2010***. § 8106
2. The candidate may submit signatures to cover all or any prorated portion of the filing fee. § 8106(b)(3)
3. A registered voter may sign an in-lieu of filing fee petition for any candidate for whom he or she is eligible to vote. However, candidates filing signatures-in-lieu pursuant to the provisions of Section 8106(a)(6) are limited to members of their own party. § 8106(a)(6) & (b)(1)

B. FOR PARTISAN CANDIDATES ONLY

1. Obtain nomination documents from the county elections official of the candidate's county of residence between **February 9, 2010, and March 1, 2010**, inclusive. Nomination documents include nomination papers for collecting signatures and a Declaration of Candidacy that must be executed by the candidate. §§ 333, 10704(a) & 13107.3
 - a. The Declaration of Candidacy shall be obtained from, and delivered to, the elections official of the county in which the candidate resides and is a voter. §§ 8040, 8064
 - b. The county elections official shall require all candidates filing a Declaration of Candidacy to execute the declaration in his or her office unless the candidate designates in writing a third party to obtain the declaration form from the county elections official and deliver it to the candidate. The written statement shall state that the candidate is aware that the Declaration of Candidacy must be properly executed and delivered not later than **March 1, 2010**, to the office of the county elections official from whom it was obtained. The statement must be signed and dated by the candidate. Any person may return the completed Declaration of Candidacy. §§ 8028, 10704

*Asterisked dates indicate that the deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday; in most cases, the deadline will move forward to the next business day. §15

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2. Gather between 40 and 60 signatures for filing the nomination paper. § 8062(a)(2)
 - a. Signatures on the in-lieu filing fee petitions may satisfy this signature requirement if the signers are of the same party as the candidate. § 8061
 - b. All signers must be registered voters in the district or political subdivision and members of the same political party as the candidate. §§ 100, 8068
 - c. The candidate may appoint persons to circulate the nomination paper. Circulators shall be voters in the district or political subdivision in which the candidate is to be voted on and shall serve only in that district or political subdivision. § 8066
 - d. Between **February 9, 2010**, and **March 1, 2010**, each section of the nomination paper shall be delivered to the county elections official of the county in which the signer resides and is a voter. §§ 8063, 10704(a)
 - e. Any candidate may obtain signatures to and sign his or her own nomination papers. § 106(a)

C. FOR INDEPENDENT CANDIDATES ONLY

1. Obtain nomination documents from the county elections official of the candidate's county of residence between **February 9, 2010**, and **March 1, 2010**, inclusive. Nomination documents include nomination papers for collecting signatures and a Declaration of Candidacy that must be executed by the candidate. §§ 333, 10704(a) & 13107.3
 - a. The nomination papers must be signed by voters in the district not less in number than 500 or 1% of the entire vote cast in the area at the preceding general election, whichever is less, nor more than 1,000. **For this election, the signature requirement is 500.** § 8400
 - b. Any candidate may obtain signatures to and sign his or her own nomination papers. § 106(a)
 - c. All signers must be eligible registered voters in the district or political subdivision in which the candidate is running at the time they sign the nomination papers. §§ 100, 8400
 - d. The candidate may appoint persons to circulate the nomination paper. Circulators shall be voters in the district or political subdivision in which the candidate is to be voted on and shall serve only in that district or political subdivision. § 8451

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2. File with the county elections official, not later than **March 1, 2010**, a Declaration of Candidacy which states the following:
 - a. The candidate's complete residence address;
 - b. That the candidate is a voter in the precinct in which he or she resides;
 - c. The name of the office sought;
 - d. That he or she will not withdraw as a candidate before the election;
 - e. That if elected, he or she will qualify for the office; and
 - f. That the candidate is not, and was not at any time during the three (3) months preceding the filing of the Declaration of Candidacy, registered as affiliated with a political party qualified under Section 5100. §§ 8550 & 10704

D. FOR WRITE-IN CANDIDATES ONLY

1. Filing Fee

Write-in candidates are not required to pay filing fees. § 8604

2. Nomination Papers

Gather between 40 and 60 signatures for filing the nomination paper. §§ 8062(a)(2), 8600

- a. For the special primary election, between **February 15, 2010***, and **March 30, 2010**, circulate nomination papers for signatures and leave them for examination with the county elections official of the county in which the signers reside. § 8601
- b. Signers must be voters in the district or political subdivision in which the write-in candidate is to be voted on and of the same political party as the party in which the write-in candidate is seeking nomination in the primary. § 8603
- c. For the special general election, between **April 12, 2010**, and **May 25, 2010**, circulate nomination papers for signatures and leave them for examination with the county elections official of the county in which the signers reside. § 8601
- d. There is no party affiliation requirement for signers of write-in nomination petitions in the special general election.

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- e. The candidate may appoint persons to circulate the nomination paper. Circulators shall be voters in the district or political subdivision in which the candidate is to be voted on and shall serve only in that district or political subdivision. § 8066
 - f. Each section of the nomination paper shall be delivered to the county elections official of the county in which the signer resides and is a voter not later than **March 30, 2010**, for the special primary election; not later than **May 25, 2010**, for the special general election. § 8601
3. Statement of Write-In Candidacy
- Between **February 15, 2010***, and **March 30, 2010**, for the special primary election and **April 12, 2010**, and **May 25, 2010**, for the special general election, file a Statement of Write-In Candidacy. The Statement of Write-In Candidacy shall contain the following information:
- a. Candidate's name;
 - b. Candidate's complete residence address;
 - c. A declaration stating that the candidate is a write-in candidate;
 - d. The name of the office for which the candidate is running;
 - e. The party nomination which the candidate seeks, if running in a primary election (a candidate need not be registered with the party whose nomination he or she is seeking); and
 - f. The date of the election. §§ 8600, 8601, 10704
4. In order to be nominated at the special primary election, the write-in candidate must receive more votes than any other candidate running for that party's nomination, and must also receive votes equal to at least 1% of all votes cast for that office at the last preceding general election at which the office was filled. For this election the requisite vote requirement is **1,354**. § 8605(a)

III. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Each of the forms mentioned above is available free of charge from the county elections official. § 8101

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- B. The California State Assembly has 80 members elected for two-year terms. This election is for the remainder of the term. Cal. Const., art IV, § 2(a)
