05/20/11 <sup>†</sup>	(E-53)	2 <b>POLITICAL PARTY ENDORSEMENTS</b> Last day for any qualified political party to submit to the county elections official a list of all candidates for voter-nominated office who will appear on any ballot in the county in question, and who have been endorsed by the party. The county elections official shall print any such list that is timely received in the sample ballot.	§ 13302(b)

06/02/11 to 06/21/11	(E-40 to E-21)	5 <b>COUNTIES MAIL SAMPLE BALLOTS</b> Period in which the county elections official shall mail a polling place notice and sample ballot to each registered voter. The polling place notice may state whether the polling place is accessible to the physically handicapped.	§§ 13303, 13304
06/13/11	(E-29)	6 <b>PRECINCT BOARD MEMBERS AND POLLING PLACES</b> Last day for the county elections official to appoint the members of the several precinct boards and designate the polling places.	§ 12286
06/13/11	(E-29)	7 <b>VOTE-BY-MAIL VOTERS</b> First day for the county elections official to process applications for vote-by-mail ballots for the special general election.	§ 3001
06/21/11	(E-21)	8 <b>SAMPLE BALLOTS</b> Last day for the county elections official to mail sample ballots to voters for the special general election.	§ 13303
06/27/11	(E-15)	9 <b>VOTER REGISTRATION</b> Last day to register to vote in the special general election.	§§ 2102, 2107
06/28/11 to 07/05/11	(E-14 to E-7)	10 <b>NEW CITIZEN REGISTRATION PERIOD</b> Period in which new citizens may register to vote. A new citizen registering to vote after the close of registration shall provide the county elections official with proof of citizenship prior to voting and shall declare that he or she has established residency in California.	§§ 331, 3500, 3501
06/28/11	(E-14)	11 <b>BILINGUAL PRECINCT BOARD MEMBERS</b> Last day to prepare a list of precincts to which bilingual officers were appointed. A copy of this list shall be made available to the public.	§ 12303(d)
07/2/11**	(E-10)	12 <b>PUBLICATION OF TALLY CENTER LOCATION</b> On or before this date, a notice shall be published by the county elections official at least once in a newspaper of general circulation within the district specifying the public place to be used as the central tally center for counting the ballots.	§ 12109
07/05/11	(E-7)	13 <b>VOTE-BY-MAIL VOTERS</b> The last day to file an application for a vote-by-mail voter ballot.	§ 3001
07/05/11	(E-7)	14 <b>NEW CITIZEN REGISTRATION</b> Last day for new citizen registration.	§ 3500

<sup>†</sup>The federal MOVE Act requires that ballots be sent to military and overseas voters not later than 45 days prior to a federal election. Pursuant to Elections Code section 3112, dates prescribed by the Elections Code have been adjusted to accommodate the 45-day mailing of ballots to military and overseas voters; the dates must be adhered to and deadlines do not move forward if the dates fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday.

07/06/11 to 07/11/11	(E-6 to E-1)	16 <b>SPECIAL ABSENTEE VOTER - RECALLED TO MILITARY SERVICE</b> Period in which a registered special absentee voter recalled to service after July 5, 2011 (E-7), but before 5:00 p.m. on July 11, 2011 (E-1), may appear before the county elections official and obtain a vote-by-mail ballot which may be voted in, or outside, the county elections official's office on or before the close of the polls and returned as are other voted vote-by-mail ballots.	§ 3110
07/06/11 to 07/12/11	(E-6 to E)	17 <b>VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS - LATE CONDITIONS</b> On or between these dates, any voter may apply in writing for a vote-by-mail ballot if he or she will be unable to go to the polls on Election Day. The voter may designate any authorized representative to return the voted vote-by-mail ballot.	§ 3021
07/11/11	(E-1) [5:00 p.m.]	18 <b>SPECIAL ABSENTEE VOTER - RECALLED TO MILITARY SERVICE</b> The last day a registered special absentee voter recalled to service after July 5, 2011 (E-7), but before 5:00 p.m. on July 11, 2011 (E-1), may obtain from the county elections official a vote-by-mail ballot which can be voted in, or outside, the county elections official's office on or before the close of the polls and returned as are other voted vote-by-mail ballots.	§ 3110
07/12/11	(E)	19 <b>SPECIAL ABSENTEE VOTERS</b> Any registered special absentee voter who has returned to their county of registration on or before this day, and to whom a vote-by-mail ballot has been mailed but not voted, may apply to vote in the county elections official's office or in a polling place.  An unregistered special absentee voter who was released from service after the close of registration and who has returned to his or her county of residence may apply in person to register with the county elections official and vote in the election. Documentary proof of release from service is required. On or before the day of the election, the county elections official shall deliver to the precinct board a list of special absentee voters registered under Elections Code section 3107.  A special absentee voter who returns to the county after July 5, 2011 (E-7), may appear before the county elections official and apply for registration, a vote-by-mail ballot, or both. The county elections official shall register the voter, if not registered, and shall deliver a vote-by-mail ballot which may be voted in, or outside, the county elections official's office on or before the close of the polls on the day of the election and returned as are other voted vote-by-mail ballots.	§§ 300(b), 3108  § 3107  § 3109

07/22/11	(E+10)	21 <b>OFFICIAL CANVASS</b> Last day for the county elections official to complete the official canvass and certify results to the Secretary of State.	Date designated by Secretary of State
08/19/11	(E+38)	22 <b>CERTIFICATION OF ELECTION (CANDIDATE)</b> Last day for the Secretary of State to determine votes cast for Congress and to certify the person having the highest number of votes for that office as duly elected. It is the intention of the Secretary of State to issue a certificate immediately after receipt of the results of the official canvass.	§§ 15501, 15504
