Traditional Polling Place	<p><b>In-Person Voting Locations:</b> Open on Election Day from 7am - 8pm</p> <p><b>Ballot Drop-off Locations:</b> 1 per 30,000 voters OR a minimum of 2 (whichever results in the greater number of locations); E-28 through Election Day open at a minimum during regular business hours (Elections Code section 3025.5)</p> <p><b>1 Exterior Drop Box:</b> E-28 through Election Day open a minimum of 12 hours</p>	<p>Election conducted under Elections Code sections 12223 and 3025.5</p>
