WHAT IS THE CALIFORNIA UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE BALLOT BOWL?

Established in 2018, the California University and College Ballot Bowl is a friendly competition where all California higher education systems can compete to register the most students to vote.

Eligible campuses include:

- 116 California Community College (CCC)
- 23 California State University (CSU)
- 10 University of California (UC)
- 85 Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities (AICCU)

The purpose of the California University and College Ballot Bowl is to:

- Inspire the students to become active participants in our democracy
- Motivate campuses to adopt and implement policies that boost civic engagement and participation
- Showcase best practices and most civically engaged California colleges and universities

Each college will be encouraged to promote the competition using a simple timeline that fits the needs of their campus.

HOW TO PLAY

How Can My Campus Participate?

The California Secretary of State's Students Vote Project will track student voter registration to your campus with the following methods:

- Online voter registration
 - RegisterToVote.ca.gov/?t=s
 - TurboVote
- Physical voter registration
 - Voter registration cards (VRC) can be requested by campuses from the Secretary of State's office. Please note in the request form that they are for the Ballot Bowl Competition.

How Does Your Campus Win?

- Overall Champion
 - One campus will be awarded overall champion with the highest number of student voter registrations across all higher education systems
- There will be awards given in each higher education system for the categories below:
 - Highest number of students registered minus the overall champion
 - Highest percentage of its student body registered
 - Most creative approach to registering students*
- Your campus can only win one award

HOW TO PLAY (CONT.)

Timeline (Tentative)

- July 2022: Notify Higher Education Students and Campuses about the 2022 Ballot Bowl
- August 3, 2022: Students Vote Project Workshop and Toolkit Distribution
- August 15, 2022: 2022 University and College Ballot Bowl Begins
- November 8, 2022: Election Day/Ballot Bowl Ends
- December 5, 2022: Campus Winners Announced

Best Practices

It is strongly encouraged that your campus collaborate with clubs and student leaders throughout this competition. Below is a list of methods to help increase engagement:

- Host voter registration tables at campus events
- Register students during student move-in day
- Print and distribute flyers in residential halls and/or in common areas on campus
- Post voter registration messaging on social media and/or relevant websites
