# California Students Vote Project Background

Established in 2016, the California Secretary of State's (SOS) Students Vote Project (SVP) is a leading statewide, nonpartisan program that elevates student voices and promotes student civic engagement efforts to build a more inclusive democracy.

In 2019, Assembly Bill 963 was passed, enacting The Student Civic and Voter Empowerment Act (SCVEA). In 2020, the SVP was expanded to implement the SCVEA, which requires California Community Colleges and California State Universities to inform and mobilize student voters. Campuses achieve this by participating in learning opportunities provided by the Secretary of State's office to promote civic engagement and student voter registration.

While the University of California and the Association of Independent California College and University institutions are not required to participate, they have continued to be strong supporters of student civic engagement.

The SVP team invites everyone to use and share this resource guide to help higher education students better understand the process of registering and turning out to vote.

## Important Civic and Election Dates:

#### **2022 General Election**

- Tuesday, September 20: National Voter Registration Day
- Monday, October 10: Counties offer early voting sites to find a location, please visit
   CAEarlyVoting.sos.ca.gov
- Monday, October 24: Last day to register to vote online or by mail ahead of the General Election
- Tuesday, October 25 Tuesday, November 8: Same Day Voter Registration is available
   - voters can "conditionally" register and vote at a county elections office or polling location
   after the voter registration deadline, up to and including Election Day
- Tuesday, November 1: Deadline for county elections official to send a registered voter a vote-bymail ballot
- Tuesday, November 8: General Election

#### **2022 Additional Key Dates:**

- Monday, August 15 Tuesday, November 8: University and College Ballot Bowl Competition
- Monday, October 3 Friday, October 7: National Voter Education Week
- Friday, October 28, 2022: Vote Early Day
- Monday, November 7, 2022: Election Hero Day

# Important Election Questions

#### Am I Eligible to Vote in California?

To register to vote in California, you must be:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California
- 18 years old or older on Election Day
- Not currently in a state or federal prison for the conviction of a felony
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court

#### **How Can I Register to Vote?**

You can register online at **RegisterToVote.ca.gov/?t=s**. To register online, you will need the following information:

- California driver's license or California identification card number
- Last four digits of your social security number
- Date of birth
- Visit RegisterToVote.ca.gov/?t=s to register or update your information
- Note: If you do not have a driver's license or identification card, you can still register. You will need to verify your identity when voting for the first time

#### To register by paper:

- Visit your county elections office or library for paper voter registrations
- Visit sos.ca.gov/elections/voting-resources/county-elections-offices to find the contact information for your county elections official
- Note: It is important that your voter registration application be filled out completely and be postmarked or hand-delivered to your county elections office at least 15 days before the election

#### What Address Can I Use to Register to Vote?

- You can register to vote with your permanent home address or your campus address
- You may not register to vote in two places during the same election cycle
- A vote-by-mail ballot and Voter Information Guide will be mailed to the address you used to register





# Important Election Questions (Continued)

#### **Attending School Out of State?**

- You may choose to register to vote using your home-away-from-home address you use while at school or your traditional home address
- Choosing which address to use when you register to vote is a personal decision
- You can only register in one state

#### **Do I Need Identification When I Vote?**

- In most cases, a California voter is not required to show identification before casting a ballot
- If you did not provide identification when you registered to vote, you may be asked to provide identification when you cast your ballot. Types of certified identification include:
  - Government issued photo identification card
  - Student identification card
  - A copy of a recent utility bill
  - The county voter information guide sent to you by your county elections office

#### What if English is Not My Preferred Language?

The Voter Information Guide is available in 10 languages on the SOS website:

- English
- Spanish
- Chinese
- Hindi
- Japanese
- Khmer
- Korean
- Tagalog
- Thai
- Vietnamese

Note: You may also request language assistance at in-person voting locations. Visit **VoterGuide.sos.ca.gov** for more information.



# Important Election Questions (Continued)

#### How Can I Vote by Mail?

- California counties must start mailing ballots to active registered voters about 29 days before statewide election
- Insert your completed ballot in the envelope provided, make sure you complete all required information on the envelope
- You may return your completed ballot on or before Election Day by:
  - Mailing it to your county elections official
  - Returning it in person to any polling place within the state or the office of your county elections official
  - Dropping your ballot off at a drop-off location or into a ballot drop box within the state; or
  - Authorizing someone to return the ballot on your behalf

#### When and Where Can I Vote?

#### **Early in Person**

- Counties in California will be offering early in-person voting opportunities
- Visit **CAEarlyVoting.sos.ca.gov** to find your nearest polling location

#### **Early by Mail**

- Sign and mail your ballot as soon as you complete it
- Completed vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day

#### **Secure Drop Box**

• The secure drop box shall be clearly and visibly marked as an "Official Ballot Drop Box" that shows language stating that tampering with the drop box is a felony

#### **Election Day**

- Polling locations will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day
- If you are in line by the closing time, then you have a right to vote





# Important Election Questions (Continued)

#### Where's My Ballot?

Sign-up at **WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov** to track if your ballot has been mailed, received, counted, or if there were any issues. You can choose to receive updates by:

- Email
- Text message (SMS)
- Voice call

#### What is Redistricting and How Does it Affect You?

Following the 2020 Census, updated information about California's population was used to redraw county and electoral lines. These changes were made by the California Citizens Redistricting Commission. Visit **www.sos.ca.gov/elections/california-redistricting** for more information.

### **Voter Checklist**



## Update Your Voter Registration

- Every active registered voter will receive a vote-by-mail ballot for the 2022 General Election
- Check or update your voter registration information as early as possible at RegisterToVote.ca.gov/?t=s to ensure your vote-by-mail ballot is sent to the correct address



## **Choose How You Will Vote**

- Voting by Mail: This is a secure and safe way to return your ballot
- **Voting in Person:** In-person locations offer important resources such as Same Day Voter Registration, ADA accommodations, replacement ballots, and other support in various languages



## **Identify When and Where You Will Vote**

- Early in Person: Counties in California will be offering early in-person voting opportunities; visit CAEarlyVoting.sos.ca.gov to find your nearest polling location
- Early by Mail: Sign and mail your ballot as soon as you complete it; completed vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day
- **Secured Drop Box:** The secure drop box shall be clearly and visibly marked as an "Official Ballot Drop Box" that shows language stating that tampering with the drop box is a felony
- **Election Day:** Voting Locations will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2022; if you are in line by the closing time, then you have a right to vote
